

Expo on lifelong learning

he Hong Kong Community College (HKCC) and the School of Professional Education and Executive Development (SPEED) jointly held a four-day Education Expo on the University campus in July.

Also celebrating the signing of two academic agreements with overseas organizations, the opening ceremony was officiated at by Prof. Thomas Wong, Acting Dean (Professional and Continuing Education), Dr Anthony Tam, Director of

SPEED, and Dr Simon Leung, Acting Director of HKCC.

Prof. Clive Dimmock, Director of Centre for Educational Leadership and Management of the University of Leicester, entered into an agreement with PolyU to offer the Master of Science in Educational Leadership and Doctorate of Education; whereas Mr Raymond Yeung, Chairman of the Certified General Accountants Association of Canada, signed a pact to offer the Certified General Accountants of CanadaQualification Programme. The programmes will be offered through SPEED in September this year.

The Expo also provided information on the wide variety of programmes offered by HKCC and SPEED, ranging from new Associate Degree programmes, full-time and part-time Bachelor's Degree programmes, to reimbursable courses listed under the Continuing Education Fund subsidized by the Government.
