**Prof. Thomas K.S. Wong** has been promoted to the post of Chair Professor of Nursing effective August this year and will continue to be Head of the School of Nursing (SN) and Acting Dean of College of Professional and Continuing Education.

Prof. Wong has taken a leading role in the development of Telehealth and Telecare which has been designated as an Area of Strategic Development of PolyU. The Telehealth System developed by SN which is the first of its kind in Hong Kong has won Prof. Wong and his research team highly acclaimed international awards in 2002.
