Fundraising drives

he tightened government budget for tertiary education has prompted universities to step up their efforts in fundraising. During such times of need, PolyU is, however, delighted to find many helping hands from within and outside the PolyU community. With the concerted efforts of members of the University Council and Court, President, staff, alumni, students, friends and supporters of PolyU, the University has raised about \$180 million between March and December last year.

Charity starts at home

To take the lead in raising funds for the University, President **Prof. Poon Chung-kwong**, together with members of the senior management, has launched a "**PolyU Staff/Student Donation Matching Scheme**" last October.

With the generous pledges of \$350,000 by Prof. Poon, \$150,000 by Deputy President **Mr Alexander Tzang** and a total of \$500,000 from the Vice Presidents, Associate Vice President and Faculty Deans, the \$1 million matching scheme was formed to boost support from within the University.

Under the scheme, every two dollars donated by staff or students will be matched by one dollar from the \$1 million fund. All three dollars will then be used to match funding dollar-for-dollar from the Government's Matching Grant Scheme, thus generating a total of six dollars for the University. Apart from the funds matched from the Government, the sum raised by the department as well as dollars matched from the PolyU Scheme will go back to the respective department for their use.

The inventive scheme was met with enthusiastic response. By December 2003, over \$2 million have already been raised by various units and departments. The top three fundraising departments are the Jockey Club Rehabilitation Engineering Centre, Department of Applied Biology and Chemical Technology and School of Accounting and Finance. In addition, the PolyU Staff Club has donated a sum of \$50,000 to the PolyU Development Fund. The overwhelming response to the fundraising appeal is a demonstration of the concerted efforts made by PolyU staff and students to support the University.

New Council Chairman appointed

Mr Victor Lo Chung-wing, Chairman and Chief Executive of Gold Peak Industries (Holdings) Limited, has succeeded Dr Sir Gordon Wu Yingsheung as Council Chairman of PolyU while Sir Gordon has taken up the Chairmanship of CityU Council, both for a period of three years with effect from 1 January 2004. The two appointments, made by the Chief Executive, were announced by the Government on 19 December.

draw heartening response

What a wonderful surprise

Following the establishment of a \$1 billion Matching Grant Scheme by the Government last July, PolyU — with our outstanding record in teaching, research and partnership with the industry — has received a series of major donations. Among them, the largest benefaction came from Dr Lee Shau-kee, Chairman of Lee Shau Kee Foundation and a Founding Court Member of PolyU.

Originally planning to contribute a gift of \$42.5 million to PolyU, Dr Lee took all by surprise by generously increasing the sum to \$45 million during the donation ceremony held in September. He did so at a spontaneous invitation from President Prof. Poon, who pointed out that a donation of \$45 million could help the University match an equal sum from the Government, rounding up the total to \$90 million.

"By its Chinese pronunciation, the figure 'nine' can be taken to mean 'long lasting' — representing Dr Lee's long term support to PolyU and an auspicious symbol for a happy occasion indeed," said Prof. Poon. This dramatic development, which happened in just a minute, marked an unprecedented scene in the history of fund-

raising among local universities.

Dr Lee's manificient contribution was the largest received by the University since the establishment of the Matching Grant Scheme. Dr Lee remarked, "I share the University's mission of nurturing preferred graduates for society, and its outstanding results are evident under the able leadership of the Council Chairman Sir Gordon Wu and Prof. Poon."

3 records set by PolyU

With its unifying efforts and creativeness, the University has scored three firsts in Hong Kong in its recent fundraising campaigns.

The first of the three happened on 23 September 2003 at the donation ceremony of Dr Lee Shau-kee. Dr Lee, who initially agreed to donate \$42.5 million to PolyU, decided to increase his sum to \$45 million at an impromptu invitation of Prof. Poon. Dr Lee said, among other institutions, PolyU stood out with clear vision in providing professional education and research of an applied nature. The generous donation was made to pay tribute to the University's outstanding performance.

The second first occurred last November when PolyU proudly received a donation of RMB5 million yuan from Dr Lu Guanqiu, Founder and Managing Director of Wanxiang Group and an honorary graduate of PolyU. The significant donation has made PolyU the first institution in Hong Kong to receive such a large donation from the mainland. Dr Lu's contribution also sets a good example for leaders and entrepreneurs on the mainland to support higher education in Hong

The third first was the unique "PolyU Staff/Student **Donation Matching Scheme**", initiated by President Prof. Poon Chung-kwong, together with members of the senior management. The scheme was extremely well received. As of December 2003, over \$2 million dollars were pledged from various departments and funds were quickly matched from the scheme. The \$1 million scheme, which is the first of its kind, has reaped overwhelming response from staff and students.

Ardent support from community at large

In response to the Government's Matching Grant Scheme, PolyU was most fortunate to have received a host of donations from members of the University Council and Court from March to December last year. Among them, a significant donation came from former Council Chairman **Dr Sir Gordon Wu Ying-sheung and Lady Ivy Wu** who have donated \$15 million to the University. Another sizable donation came from Council member, **Mr Jonathan Choi Koon-shum**, who is also President of Sun Wah Group. Mr Choi generously made a donation of \$15 million in support of the University's long term development. In addition, current Council Chairman **Mr Victor Lo Chung-wing**, council members **Mr Roy Chung Chi-ping**, **Dr Chow Yei-ching**, **Mrs Katherine Ngan Ng Yu-ying**, **Mr Kenneth Ting Woo-shou** and **Mr Yu Kwok-chun** have also rendered their generous support to PolyU.

Other heartening support was also received from members of the University Court, including **Dr Cheng Yu-tung**, **Dr David Chu**, **Dr Patrick Fung Yuk-bun**, **Dr Stanley Ho**, **Mr Ng Wai-hung** and **Dr Stephen Tai Tak-fung**.

"Their donations mean a lot to us; not only did they enable the University to match grant from the Government, they also set good examples for others to follow," said Mr Tzang.

Dr Raymond Chan, alumnus and Group Chairman and CEO of IDT International Limited, is one of the shiny examples. In the last few years alone, Dr Chan has donated no less than \$27 million in support of his alma mater. In recognition of his benefaction, the University dedicated a wing of its Professional Complex and the swimming pool in the Student Halls of Residence to Dr Chan and his wife Mrs Shirley Chan, and had them named after Mrs Chan.

In order to mobilize support from the community, creative minds were brought together to brainstorm new fundraising initiatives. Very recently, the University held its second golfing event, namely, the PolyU-Kum Shing Invitation Golf Tournament, at the Mission Hills Golf Club in Shenzhen to raise funds on the green.

Last September, the University launched the first-of-its-kind "**PolyU Privilege Card**" programme to enlist support from friends and alumni of the University. With a minimum donation of \$1,500, donors are invited to be members of the card programme. Cardholders are offered special discounts and benefits in dining, entertainment and shopping from major hotel chains, restaurants, retail outlets as well as university facilities and educational services. Through soliciting annual donations, the programme seeks to promote ongoing support from the community.

Since the launch of the programme, more than 1,800 members have already signed up, generating over \$2.7 million donation for the University.

PolyU friends and supporters are also encouraged to render their support to the University by becoming "Chair Sponsors" for the seats in the Chiang Chen Studio Theatre, Jockey Club Auditorium or other lecture theatres. Or they can become "Bricks Sponsors", with their names marked on bricks on campus. With a minimum donation of \$500, donors' names will be acknowledged on the University website.

Sharing his tips on fundraising, Prof. Poon remarked: "It takes years for any institution to build its fundraising network. This is the case for many leading universities in the US and Europe. Compared to other sister institutions, I am pleased to say so far PolyU has performed satisfactorily."

"While we are most grateful to see many helping hands from different sectors of the community, we will continue to work hard and pull support together to strive for a better, brighter future for PolyU."

理大籌篡運動 社會熱烈支持

■對政府收緊對大學敎育的撥款,各院校均費盡心思,推行各種籌款新招數。在這非常時期,理大很榮幸能夠得到 社會各界的支持。在校董會及顧問委員會成員、校長與理大全體同事、校友、學生及其他友好眾志成城的努力下, 理大自去年三月至十二月底,成功籌得捐款約一億八千萬元,成績令人鼓舞。

發動校內籌款

為推動校內的籌款風氣,校長潘宗光教授與管理層成員率先發 起籌款活動,於去年十月成立一個**專為理大教職員及學生而設的補** 助基金計劃。

該基金總值港幣一百萬元,分別由潘校長捐出三十五萬元、 **曾慶忠**常務副校長捐出十五萬元,以及各位副校長、協理副校長及 學院院長合共捐出五十萬元而組成,目的是鼓勵校內成員踴躍捐 款。

根據該計劃內容,各同事或學生每捐出兩元,便可獲配對一 元,籌得的三元將用作向政府的「等額補助基金計劃」申請額外資 助。在籌得的六元款項中,其中三元將撥入大學發展基金,餘款將 撥歸最初籌得捐款的部門作為經費。

計劃推出以來反應踴躍,直至去年十二月,各部門共承諾捐出 款項二百多萬元,遠超該計劃可申請的配額。其中籌得最多款項的 三個部門分別為:賽馬會復康科技中心、應用生物及化學科技學 系、會計及金融學院。另外,理工大學教職員會所代表各會員,捐 出五萬元給本校的發展基金,充份反映理大上下一心,為大學的未 來積極捐輸。
