leamed by the boundless creativity and business talent of the students, the Contest came to a successful close in September. Under the generous sponsorship of Dr Raymond Chan, Chairman and CEO of IDT International Limited, this meaningful event has been held for three consecutive years.

This year, 45 multi-disciplinary teams comprising a total of more than 140 students competed in four categories, namely IT and Health Care Products, Telecommunication and Personal Devices, Home Appliances and Toys. Seven out of 25 teams were short-listed for the final competition. During the final, each team was required to formulate and present its business plan to the judging panel with focuses on either innovative technology or product development.

Following rounds of interesting and inspiring presentations, the judging panel came up with winners for the eight awards including first runner-ups, category winners and the Diamond Award of Innovation. The Diamond Award of Innovation was selected among the three category winners.

Each winning team received a plaque, a certificate of merit and a cash prize ranging from \$8,000 to \$25,000. Their works would also be granted the opportunity to receive support for further development and may be launched in the market through the University's Innovation and Technology Incubation Programme.
