Prof. Ronald So, Chair and Head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, will be conferred the honorary doctorate of engineering by the prestigious University of Waterloo, Canada, at its upcoming Fall Convocation. This honour recognizes his significant contributions to the advancement of engineering science and education.

What's more, Prof. So has also been appointed as Guest Professor of the School of Aerospace Engineering, Tsinghua University, Beijing. The appointment lasts for three years during which Prof. So will share his extensive research experience with the students of Tsinghua University.

A renowned academic who joined the PolyU family in 1996, Prof. So has received many international awards during his academic life.

Tribute to researcher in quality of life

Dr Anna Lau, Assistant Professor of the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences, has recently been awarded the Distinguished Research Fellow Award by the International Society for Quality of Life Studies (ISQOLS), an international authority on Quality of Life (QOL). The award was recognition of her substantial contributions to QOL research.

Outside PolyU, Dr Lau is the Hong Kong Principal Researcher, Convenor and Regional Coordinator for China of the International Wellbeing Group which aims to develop a cross-cultural measure for Subjective QOL for the promotion and enhancement of subjective wellbeing of populations.
