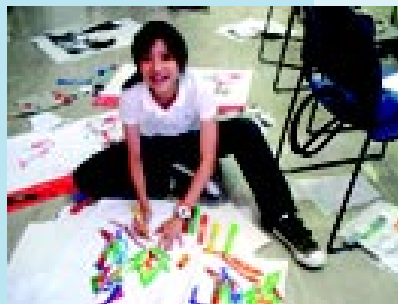


# Summer camps with flying colours

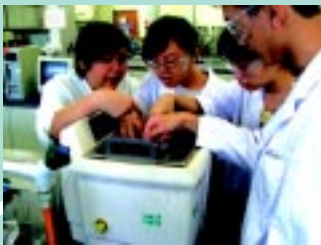
## Exploring the frontiers of design
