



ore than 250 staff members were presented the Long Service Awards in recognition of their dedicated service to the University over the years at a special ceremony held in January. Among the awardees, 116 have served in the Institution for 15 years, 48 for 20 years. 74 for 25 years and another 18 for as long as 30 years. Each of them received a certificate and a souvenir from President Prof. Poon Chung-kwong as token of appreciation from the University. Since 1990, PolyU has introduced the annual Long Service Award scheme to honour loyal staff members and to cultivate a sense of belonging among the PolyU community.



Textiles expert honoured

prof. Tao Xiaoming, Head and Chair Professor of the Institute of Textiles and Clothing (ITC), has recently been honoured with the Textile Science and Technology Award (First-class Prize) of the Sang Ma Trust Fund, in recognition of her research breakthrough on yarn manufacturing technologies. The research is about developing a one-step manufacturing method and apparatus for low torque singles ring spun yarns.

Highly regarded in the textile community, Prof. Tao is also currently the elected World President of The Textile Institute, an international organization which promotes professionalism in all areas associated with the textile industries.

The Sang Ma Trust Fund was founded by the late Mr Cha Chiming in 1992 which aims at promoting the development and advancement of scientific research for the textile industry on the Chinese mainland, and the award is widely recognized in the field.

Aspecial ceremony was held in December to pay tribute to the winners of the 2006/07 "President's Awards for Excellent Performance/ Achievement", the "Faculty/School Awards for Outstanding Performance/ Achievement" and the "Outstanding Performance/Achievement Awards for Non-academic Staff".

The scheme adopts a two-tier awards structure. Out of the 14 individuals and five teams who have won the latter two Awards, three individuals and three teams were selected and presented the President's Awards. 


Individual Awards


