

Academic Advising Objectives:

- Considering the diversified learning backgrounds of school leavers under the New Secondary School curriculum & the flexible approach of admitting students to the new 4-year curriculum, a new structure of academic advising will be implemented, including two tiers of academic advising:
 - · Department-based academic advising; and
 - Academic advising at the institutional level operated by Office of General University Requirements (OGUR), Ms. Irene Cheng (TU435, 34008204)

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Components of Academic Advising at ITC

- Conveying the purposes of the University: includes advice regarding aims of higher education, academic requirements, etc.
- Information giving: includes advice about registration, course offerings, educational opportunities, etc.
- **Programme planning:** includes advice on scheduling sequences, course planning, relationship between majors and occupations, etc.
- Student referral: referring students with special needs to specialised campus services at SAO and OGUR, etc.
- Facilitating student development: includes interest in student's goals
 and problems, establishment of rapport, development of the student's selfawareness, etc.

Academic Advising at ITC

- Appointment of Academic Advisors (coordinators of the 6 Majors) and Year Tutors (at tutor-student ratio of 1:20)
- Year 1: each student will have a single Year Tutor throughout his/her entire study at ITC. They are required to meet once every semester to discuss different academic issues (e.g. study paths, interests, academic inspirations, etc.). Suitable records of the student's progress upon each meeting will be kept.
- Year 2: students are streamed into different majors. Apart from Year
 Tutor, students can talk with Academic Advisors. Students can also seek
 advices about various co-curricular activities so as to widen their horizons
 and acquire a global perspective from different sources such as

 Departmental Student Exchange Officer and Career Officer.

Academic Advising at ITC

- Year 3: Year Tutor and Academic Advisor will serve as the source of direction and help students to select elective subjects, FYP, and even enroll in a minor programme to explore their alternative avenues of interest and career paths.
- Year 4: Year Tutor, Career Officer and Academic Advisor will advise students about a long-range self-development plan (e.g. the choice of career and postgraduate study








Minor Study & Student Exchange Programme

Minor Study

- 1. Call for application: mid-October of each year
- 2. Students can submit their applications to and obtain approval from the Minor-offering Dept, starting from their 2^{nd} year of study
- 3. The credit requirement of a Minor is 18 credits. Subject to approval by the Minor-offering department, students may count up to 6 credits from their Major (i.e. DSR) or GUR subjects towards their chosen Minor.
- 4. Only students with a GPA of 2.5 or above can be considered for Minor Study enrolment

SEP

- 1. Call for application: Feb/Mar of each year
- 2. 14490 students are invited to join the SEP in year 3, semesters 1 and 2, of the study.
- Students should have good academic standing (GPA 3.0 or above for non-Design students, GPA2.8 or above for Design students).

Remarks

- 1. The academic advising system is posted on ITC website.
- 2. Students are informed about academic advising and their assigned Year Tutor at the beginning of the semester by email.
- 3. To facilitate students' communication and discussion, Blackboard (LMS) websites (will last for 4 years) are established for each Year Tutor. Year Tutors can use one or more of a variety of delivery options, e.g. face-to-face, small group, email, telephone, Blackboard, social media, etc. so as to keep suitable connections with students.
- **4. Consent Form for Disclosure of Information** in Academic Advising (sign & return to GO ASAP. They may also give and/or withdraw consent via **eStudent**.
- 5. Students should be reminded to update their contact information, particularly for non-local students.

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
