1. How has your on-the-job training helped you to perform your job duties? Please give one or two examples.

Under the CODP, we have many chances to attend seminars or courses related to our job. I took courses regarding frontline operations in the first half year when I joined the Company. The training covered general skills with the lecturers sharing their experiences, which provided me solid knowledge in understanding the operation of a construction project, especially to a fresh graduate with only textbook knowledge and equations in mind. Such opportunities helped a lot in adapting to the complex working environment at a construction site in a short period, and made me consider more about the constraints of the operation team when handling coordination works and designs.
