Research Topic:	The Use of a Brief Mental Health Program and Positive Psychology Intervention in Promoting Mental Health among Low-income Families
Short Description of the Research Project:	Mental health is an important issue, particularly for low-income families. When compared with high-income families, low-income families have more disadvantaged health outcomes. However, a review found that governments have emphasized addressing poverty at the country level but neglected to build families' personal attributes, thereby reducing their capacity to cope with distress resulting from poverty. This project aims to promote mental health in low-income families with children by using a brief mental health program and positive psychology intervention. This project can increase the awareness of promoting mental health in low-income families. It can also benefit schools, non-governmental organizations and the country by introducing and implementing this intervention in low-income families, aiming at promoting their mental health.
