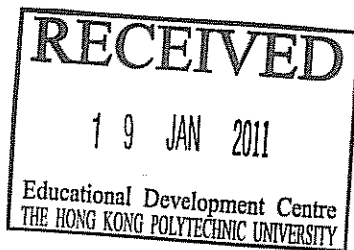

PART II: DETAILS OF PROPOSAL

1. Project objectives and significance

(What are your objectives in initiating this project? How does it align with the goals and targets of the University, your faculty/ school or your department in implementing OBE?)

In Faculty of Engineering, all departments have started implementing OBE for some years. Great amount of effort has been devoted and some positive results have been achieved. They include the establishment of programme outcomes, development of P-LOAP, revamping of all definitive programme documents to include the mapping between subjects and programme outcomes, revising all subject syllabi to include subject learning outcomes and align with the programme outcomes, etc. Besides, there are many other learning and teaching activities using OBA in the Faculty including the study tours, employer and alumni survey, video-taping final year project presentation, the assessment of subject learning outcomes, etc. As to the programme outcome assessment, some programmes have already finished the first round of assessment while some others are still midway of the implementation as scheduled in the P-LOAP.

While departments have already acquired some experience in OBE implementation, the Faculty believes that it is a good time to have an overall review in the Faculty in order to steer all departments to a similar direction in OBE implementation. Based on the review, the Faculty would also like to seek for the way forward that will further enhance the system. It is believed that external expert advice will be particularly useful at this important moment. Departments can contrast their own experience with that in other countries where OBE has been established and matured.

The objective of this project is to invite an external expert to help in reviewing the OBE implementation in the Faculty and providing suggestions on the way forward. The external expert whom will be hired should review the related documents of all programmes and meet with the related personnel in all departments of the Faculty. An open seminar should be held to summarize the findings and make suggestions on further work necessary.

The work can be divided into three stages:

Stage 1 Preparation (February – April, 2011)

At this stage, all related documents should be sent to the external expert. An initial report should be generated to comment on the progress of OBE implementation of each programme.

Stage 2 – Visit (May 2011)

At this stage, the external expert should pay a 4-day visit to the Faculty and meet with the related personnel of each department individually. An open seminar should be held to summarize the findings and make suggestions on further work necessary.

Stage 3 – Response of Departments (May – June 2011)

Departments should respond to the comments in written and submit to the Faculty Board.

As to the candidate of external expert, the Faculty has initially contacted Prof. Ira Jacobson of the University of Maryland. Prof. Jacobson is the former member of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (HKIE) Accreditation Board and is one of the world experts on Engineering education, outcome-based learning approaches, and programme accreditation. He has participated in many OBE activities in various tertiary institutions in Hong Kong. In particular, he was invited to visit our Faculty in 2007 and gave his expert advices at that time to help the Faculty in OBE implementation. His thorough understanding of the Faculty, and expert knowledge in OBE and outcome-based accreditation that will be implemented by HKIE will definitely benefit us in this project.

6. Impact




