#### Part II: Details of Proposal

#### 1. Project objectives:

(What are your objectives in initiating this project?)

The main objectives of the Project are:

- 1. To develop a revised Student Feedback Questionnaire (SFQ) that will enable the collection of student feedback on students' attainment of the intended learning outcomes <u>in addition to</u> that on the subject and the teaching of the staff member
- To create a prototype of an online (web-based) SFQ system that is appropriately integrated/interfaced
  with the Outcomes Module of the Bb LMS to allow the University to conduct the revised outcomes-based
  SFQ electronically via the web (including the administration of the SFQ, collection of feedback data, and
  reporting, archiving and dissemination of SFQ results)
- 3. To pilot the implementation of the revised SFQ via a web-based system in a few selected departments and subjects
- 4. To evaluate the efficacy of the revised SFQ in generating useful information for improving and appraising teaching
- 5. To evaluate the prototype of the web-based SFQ system in terms of its technical functionality, operational efficiency and scalability for a large-scale implementation for the whole university

#### 2. Impact:

(How will the project contribute to the achievement of PolyU's strategic objectives in teaching and learning or major strategic initiatives such as the development of the new 4-year undergraduate programmes, outcome-based education, work-integrated education, or blended learning, etc.?)

The Project will contribute to PolyU's strategic objectives in teaching and learning in the following ways:

- Aligning the evaluation of teaching more closely with the University's emphasis on student learning outcomes
- 2. Enabling the collection of student feedback data on the achievement of the intended learning outcomes of the subjects that can be used by programmes and/or the staff members concerned for both improvement and judgmental purposes
- 3. Providing a richer source of data (e.g., students' feedback on their attainment of the intended learning outcomes and their open-ended comments on the subject and the teaching of the staff member) for appraising teaching and learning quality
- 4. Enhancing the efficiency in the collection of SFQ data and reporting and dissemination of SFQ results via a web-based system that is properly integrated/interfaced with the LMS
