### **Biodata of the Outstanding PolyU Alumni Award 2025 Recipients**



#### **Dr Steve CHUANG Tzu-hsiung, JP**

Founder and Chief Executive Officer, ProVista Group

Dr Steve Chuang Tzu-hsiung founded ProVista Group in 1995. Under his leadership, this electronics conglomerate has become a market leader in solar power generation and energy storage systems, automotive and RV electronics and power solutions, and e-health IoT products, earning the Gold Prize and the title of Product of the Year at the Electronic Industries Awards for three consecutive years. Dr Chuang is Honorary President of the Federation of Hong Kong Industries (FHKI); during his tenure as FHKI Chairman from 2023 to 2025, he dedicated himself to promoting innovation and technology and developing the new industrialisation ecosystem. In support of the 2024 Policy Address, as then FHKI Chairman, he spearheaded the establishment of the Hong Kong New Industrialisation Development Alliance, of which he was elected Founding Chairman, fostering collaboration among the government, industry, academia, research and investment sectors. Dr Chuang has also served on the Committee on Innovation, Technology and Industry Development; the Trade and Industry Advisory Board; the Sub-committee on Development of Industries under the Advisory Committee on the Northern Metropolis; and the Board of the Hong Kong Microelectronics Research and Development Institute, among other notable public roles, while actively supporting PolyU as an Assessor for the Angel Fund Scheme, a Steering Committee Member for the Centre for Advances in Reliability and Safety, and by leading collaboration between FHKI and the University in developing the STEM Product Certification Framework.

Dr Elton Sun Wu has served as Vice President of Hyatt China since 2019, overseeing the development and operations of the Group's brand UrCove as



its Chief Executive Officer and Managing Director, during which time nearly 70 hotels have opened within five years of its launch. With over 30 years of experience in hotel management, Dr Sun previously served as General Manager of HK CTS Hotels Company Limited, successfully leading brand development and corporate expansion. He also served as Global Chief Development Officer and Executive Vice President at Huazhu Hotels Group, where he led the development and operations of several mid-scale and upper mid-scale hotel brands in China, boosting the company's overall market share. Dr Sun remains closely connected with his alma mater, currently serving as President of the PolyU School of Hotel and Tourism Management Mainland Alumni Network. He is committed to organising alumni activities to strengthen alumni networks. He also serves on the International Advisory Committee of the Research Centre for Digital Transformation of Tourism at the PolyU Academy for Interdisciplinary Research, consistently contributing his professional expertise to the PolyU community.



**Ir Tony WONG Chi-kwong, JP**

Commissioner for Digital Policy, The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China

Ir Tony Wong Chi-kwong joined the Government as an Analyst/Programmer II in 1988, and rose to the positions of Assistant Government Chief Information Officer in 2016, and Deputy Government Chief Information Officer in 2021. In 2023, he was appointed the Government Chief Information Officer. As the Digital Policy Office was established in 2024 by merging the Office of the Government Chief Information Officer with the Efficiency Office, Ir Wong became the first Commissioner for Digital Policy. He has been dedicated to formulating data-driven, user-centric and outcome-based policies and supports measures to accelerate the development of digital government and smart city, including adopting “iAM Smart” to realise “single portal for online government services”, organising large-scale cybersecurity attack and defence drills to strengthen Hong Kong's cyber security, and proactively facilitate Hong Kong's integration into the overall technology development of the country. Keen to share his wealth of professional knowledge and experience with the PolyU community, Ir Wong not only supports various University events but also serves as a mentor under the “INSPIRE” Mentorship Programme, sparing no effort in giving back to his alma mater.



### **Mr Eddie WONG Kwok-hing, CSDSM**

Commissioner of Correctional Services, The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China

Mr Eddie Wong Kwok-hing has served in the Correctional Services Department (CSD) for over 36 years. He joined the CSD as Officer in 1989 and was promoted to Senior Superintendent of Correctional Services in 2014, and to Assistant Commissioner of Correctional Services in 2017, before being appointed as Deputy Commissioner of Correctional Services in 2018. He assumed the post of Commissioner of Correctional Services in 2022. Mr Wong has been committed to utilising innovative technologies to promote the high-quality development of penal management, including the systems under the “Smart Prison” project, which were awarded a Silver Medal at the International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva for three consecutive years. Mr Wong has also introduced diversified rehabilitation programmes, such as “Project JET” launched in 2022 that provides “one-stop” training and career development opportunities for persons in custody (PICs), and the Ethics College established in 2023 that offers a Diploma of Applied Education programme for PICs. Maintaining a close connection with the University, Mr Wong has facilitated collaboration between the CSD and PolyU to promote the upcycling of food waste and the development of environmentally friendly products, injecting new impetus into the sustainable development of the correctional industry and charity services. He also actively participates in University events, sharing his extensive experience with the PolyU community.
