

# Report from Our Association's 2019-2022 President - Joseph Yu JP

During the past three years the whole world turned upside down by the pandemic. The world seems to have been shut down by COVID-19 to some extent, and our lives were like riding a roller coaster.

Our Association had held limited activities during 2020 to 2022. Nevertheless, we still had some accomplishments worth mentioning -

- 1. During our 2020 AGM Dinner held on November 15, 2020, we had guest speaker Dr. Kenny Chan talking about eye health with the topic "Muscular Degeneration Symptoms, Treatment and Precaution". 30 members and friends attended the talk live at the restaurant, while some other members joined the talk via live broadcast Zoom conferencing.
- 2. On Mother's Day May 12, 2021, we held a special talk and dinner at the Marigold Restaurant. Over 100 participants came and the talk on Professional Photography was presented by our life member and renowned design artist Alex Ma.
- 3. Our 2021 AGM Dinner event held at the Marigold Restaurant on December 2, 2021. During dinner Alex Ma did another photography presentation titled "Front Yard Birds". The event was well attended by about 120 participants. That was also the restaurant's last major event held, as it was due for closure shortly after 39 years of operation in Sydney.

We have also maintained strong ties with the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU), the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office Sydney (HKETO), our members in other states (in particular our Melbourne alumni), and the alumni associations of other Hong Kong-based universities including the HKU, the CUHK and the HK Baptist University,

On other issues I should like to particularly mention about the challenges we are facing on members communication. Nowadays communication technology is advancing super-fast, Telephone, text and e-mail are all behind. We have to implement modern applications like Facebook, WhatsApp, Google Chat, Zoom Conferencing and Microsoft Teams etc. to enhance our communication amongst our members and amongst our Association with the PolyU and other communities.

Another challenge we have is about recruiting more members (especially younger members) to join our Association. This could be improved if we can gather better information about PolyU students and alumni coming to Australia for work, study, migration and/or re-entry.

# Our Association - An Introduction

# Message from the Chief Editor (Bosco Lau 劉若山)

2022 is a significant year for us. It is not only the year when we celebrate 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, it also marks the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our PolyU (Australia) Association.

Our Association was inaugurated in Sydney back in October 2012, with the presence of PolyU's President at that time, Prof. Poon Chung-kwong. Since then, Prof. Poon had visited Australia 4 more times until his formal retirement. His successor, Prof. Timothy Tong, has also paid 5 visits to Australia since 2009. Besides these two Presidents, many other senior members of the PolyU had visited us on various occasions, they include Vice Presidents, professors, staff of the PolyU Alumni Affairs & Development Office (AADO) and others. Numerous alumni members of our Association had also visited the PolyU and attended activities such as the PolyU 70<sup>th</sup>, 75<sup>th</sup> and 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration events, Homecoming Carnivals, Greening Hong Kong by PolyU Alumni events and Open Days for new buildings established at the PolyU campus.

I, for example, had visited the PolyU at least once a year from 2003 to 2019. I visited the PolyU last in August 2019, but could not meet the current President of PolyU Prof. Teng Jin-Guang as he was unavailable at that time. During the COVID-19 pandemic from 2020 to 2022, travelling to Hong Kong had presented a problem for me. I have now booked my next trip to Hong Kong in February 2023 and hopefully I can visit the PolyU and meet Prof. Teng for the first time.

Besides these visits, our close ties with the PolyU can also be seen through:

- 1) Sponsorship of a tree, one chair and name plates [our Association has sponsored a tree The Golden-leaves Fig Tree (黃金榕), a chair at the PolyU's Jockey Club Auditorium and several name plates]
- 2) Personal donations from several alumni individuals through auctions, sponsorship of name plates and offer of scholarships
- 3) Coordination of social and site visits by various study groups from the PolyU, including MBA Study Groups, a study group from the Department of Applied Social Science, etc.
- 4) Communication with PolyU students who are in Australia on exchange student programme or temporary work placement (e.g., answering their queries and inviting them to attend our activities)
- 5) Participation in PolyU Global Alumni Leaders Forums by some of our members.
- 6) Establishing links with other overseas alumni associations of the PolyU, e.g., I had met some alumni of the PolyU Singapore Association a few times during my past trips to Singapore, and met Pauline Tsang, the Founding President of the PolyU Eastern Canada Association, in both Sydney and Hong Kong, etc.

# 理大澳洲員生會之誕生(二〇〇二年六月)

陳潔民(已故)

在二零零零年的十一月,畢業了四十年的機械和生產工程系的同學,自美、加、澳洲返港,回母校共同慶祝畢業四十週年,被邀請出席十二月八日舉行的校友離校銀禧紀念晚宴。席間校長潘宗光教授鑑於旅居澳洲員生數目不斷增長,建議籌備成立理大澳洲員生會,目的是讓居於澳洲的校友和前教職員,能與母校繼續保持聯繫和加強兩地溝通。

在二零零一年的三月,五位校友在前理工會計系教職員周秀霞女士引導下,初次在悉尼一酒樓會面,組成了一個六人籌備工作小組。小組成員包括有周秀霞、(61 年)生產工程系陳潔民、(73 年)紡織系張國華、(81 年)電腦資訊系蔡慧薇和電子工程系周伯漢及 (97 年) 土木工程系施培坤等人。在同年八月,通過成立 [香港理工大學澳洲員生會籌備委員會],邀得其他前理大師生加盟。參與工作小組成員,亦增添至十五人,包括有前理工應用物理系主任 Dr. Charles Martens 及理大中文及雙語學系講師張繼沛,並推選了周秀霞和吳步雲為籌委會正副主席。

整整的一年裡,籌備工作小組不斷努力,聯絡己分散澳洲各地之員生,起草會章,收集和整理員生的資料,建立互聯網頁等事務。在二零零二年一月廿三日,終於成功在澳洲新南威爾斯省註冊為一非牟利社團組織。繼加拿大(東西)兩岸之後,成為理大海外之第三個員生會。適逢今年是香港理工大學建校六十五週年的大日子,澳洲員生會的誕生,剛好是這羣旅居澳洲之員生,對母校一個特別的賀禮。

在二零零二年裡,理大舉辦了一連串之紀念活動,籌委會委託留港的員生,代表出席三月十五日之理大建校六十五週年紀念活動開幕,及三月十七日在香港舉行之理大校友嘉年華會。代表亦同時參與該日理大海外員生會主辦之攤位,介紹本會之成立及為理大澳洲員生會招收會員,更協助加拿大(東岸)員生會為母校義賣籌款。三月十九日,理大校長在李嘉誠樓設宴招待,並介紹其辦公室內之設施及一同與海外員生會代表拍照留念。在本會代表留港期間,理大校友事務及拓展處處長及該處全人,曾給與本會多方面協助,更為澳洲員生會設計及訂製了一面美麗而兼有代表性的旗幟,員生會全人專此致以衷心感謝。

五月五日,是剛誕生了的理大澳洲員生會一個重要的日子,為了應付 [第一次週年大會]這個日子的來臨,籌備委員會工作小組早在年初即開始分配工作,包括尋找適當聚會地點、佈置場所、派發開會宣傳、準備茶點、編印出席會員名牌及員生登記表格、徵收會費等事項。全體義務工作小組,不畏疲勞,日以繼夜協助處理會務,深表欽佩。籌備委員會主席更親手造了個非常美麗的意見箱,收集出席員生的意見。

週年大會當天,籌備委員會工作小組,很早便到會場佈置,更有籌委會員攜眷出席,幫助佈置場地、煲茶燒水、分配座椅、招待嘉賓、及為大會拍攝等。值得陳述的是當日出席大會之員生與家屬,非常踴躍,比預先估計人數還多,員生皆來自悉尼各區,而且全數即時申請成為會員,其中五份之一員生,更申請為永久會員。目前會員有來自其他省份,包括有西澳、維多利亞及昆士蘭省。

當天,推選了第一屆會長周秀霞、副會長吳步雲、秘書盧紀維、財務陳潔民、會籍幹事周伯漢、 資訊事務幹事蔡慧薇、編輯及公關幹事劉若山、特別事務幹事李曉民、康樂幹事邱玉蓮等及顧問 Dr. Charles Martens 等人。

會長簡報了理大澳洲員生會成立之經過,亦致詞歡迎出席之嘉賓及當選之幹事。同時宣報已恭請了理大校長和校友事務及拓展處處長,於二零零二年十月十二日,到悉尼主持理大澳洲員生會成立典禮及邀請了加拿大(東西)兩岸會長,出席這次慶典。典禮之安排及詳細情形,將會另行通知,歡迎各地員生,踴躍參加,出席這次盛會。

今次員生會之能夠在短短的十個月內順利誕生,除了有賴各籌委會會員通力合作外,更獲母校全人在精神及財政上鼎力支持和鼓勵,終於趕得及在母校建校六十五週年裡,成功在澳洲註冊,成為全球香港理工大學第三所海外員生會。值得一提會長周秀霞女士,在籌備成立員生會期間,處處表現出其卓越之領導才能。之前,周會長已曾在澳洲曾當過其他香港大學校友會之籌備工作,經驗豐富。今次當選為會長,實屬眾望所歸。

員生會亦獲校友羅堅律師加盟,擔當榮譽法律顧問。亦獲遠在維省投身於會計及公司秘書之劉淑 嫻女士相助,兩位在員生會草擬會章過程中,提供過不少之專業知識和法律程序。張繼沛亦為員 生會贊寫過不少中文宣傳稿件,中文網頁版,及處理所有中文文書。Dr. Martens 學識廣博,具豐富的工作組織經驗,在參與籌備工作過程中,亦提供過不少寶貴意見,解答會章內之難題,並協助書寫英文稿件及來往書信。其餘籌委會內之校友,均各展所長,分工合作,不畏勞苦與艱辛,收集和整理員生資料,建立互聯網頁及員生資料庫等事項。他們一顆熱誠參與之精神,為理大澳洲員生會尊下日後發展的基礎。

第一屆幹事接着亦開了數次會議,籌備各項員生會活動及會訊等。他們認同最重要的就是加強宣傳,讓更多居於澳洲的前香港理工大學及其前身(包括香港理工學院、香港工業專門學院和香港官立高級工業學院)員生知悉本會的成立,繼而參予及支持本會。

#### **Current and Past Presidents of Our Association**

#### Joseph YU JP (余伯威) - President (2019-2022)

我在 1968 年本想入讀香港工業學院 (HKTC) Radio Officer 的郵船電報生班。但先要修讀 EE Department Radio and TV Servicing 合格後才可修讀。讀了工專之後便改變我的人生把我帶到一個電子和電腦工程行業中達 30 多年。

60 年代最新科技是原子粒。當時 T V 還是黑白的直至 1967 年後才有彩色電視。在 1969 年時由黃永昌老師介紹我到無線電世界社工作在中學習了柯式印刷,收音機電路設計,攝影黑房技術等。由此開始為我在電腦界工作成立了一個踏腳石。

一個機會中在一間英國電腦公司 International Computers Ltd. (ICL) 招聘見習電腦技術人員時彼取錄。ICL工作時和現時理大澳洲員生會榮譽會長 Mr. Bosco Lau 成為同事 (Bosco 是從 ICL U.K. 調回香港工作,開始時擔任 Computer Support Executive)。當時 ICL 最大客戶是香港政府和其他大企業等。香港大學、香港中文大學和理工成立了 UPCC,一間聯合三所學院的Computer Centre。 我在三間大學穿梭提供支援服務。最有趣的是當時港大的電腦部主管和我同名同姓的 Dr. Joseph YU。 1977 年 ICL 收購了美國的 Singer Business Machine,公司派我到澳洲 Melbourne 分工司受訓。因而愛上澳洲,定下了我日後的移民決定。

在香港 ICL 工作 10 年中最有成功感的是從低級技術員做到高級工程師。其中最感自豪的是為香港政府運輸處安裝電腦即時換有照片駕照服務的特別打印機設計和改良硬件,當時獨一無二。

1979年有好朋友在美國一間 Fortune 500公司 Tandem Computers 工作告知我他們想在香港成立西太平洋和亞洲地區總部分公司。他推薦我去試試,一試即合這樣由我一人為他們做開荒牛。成立太平洋和南亞地區總公司。Tandem Computers 當時是不停頓的設計理念電腦,由其基本主機 16 CPU 最大可串連到 4096 CPU。主要客戶是全球證券交易所、金融機構、各政府部門和各大小企業等。我當時常要去美國、德國、日本、新加坡、馬來西亞等地公幹。當時在港機工程公司 (HAECO) 認識理大澳洲員生會另一位榮譽會長 Mr. Danial Chau。

在香港 Tandem Computers 5 年中最有成功感和自豪的是負責香港証券交易所電腦硬件安装工程。非常榮幸公司還在美國組成特別精英小組來港支援我的 project。

我在 1985 移民澳洲悉尼。在 Tandem 澳洲悉尼分公司工作。全澳洲員工 100 人,只有我一個華人。當時白澳政策還在,幸好悉尼沒有那麼嚴重。起初派我到偏遠地區工作。如 Newcastle、Wollongong 和紐省中部高原 Moss Vale 等。起初有客人叫我 China Man,但相處一段時間後便成老友。互稱 Hey Mate 並一起喝酒。

在澳洲 Tandem 工作 11 年中每星期六至星期一下午自駕到首都 Canberra 為國防部週末提供支援服務,也要支援 Queensland 和紐西蘭同事。

其間 1989 年最使我最開心和自豪是我是全澳洲第一個員工,由 Tandem 客戶選出 TOP Tandem Outstanding Performer 獎,我還被美國總公司認同是最優秀的 300 個員工之一。

1998 COMPAQ Computer 收購 Tandem 後我離開 Tandem。之後曾在下列的機構工作:

- I. Integrated Research System administrators and products QC
- 2. Westpac Banking Corporation Computer operator and small system support
- 3. IBM System programmer

在 2013 年退休後接受老朋友 Mr. Hugh Lee OAM 邀請到依士活高齡華人會做義工後我便全職投入義務社區服務,曾任下列的機構及職位:

- 1. 依士活華人高齡友誼會 副主席
- 2. 班尼郎亞產了商聯會委員
- 3. 懷德市政府慶祝農曆新年委員會委員
- 4. 香港理工大學澳洲員生會 會長 (2019-2022)

#### Dr. David LAM (林泰運博士) - President (2015-2019) and Honorary President since 2019

Dr David Lam had some of his early studies at the Hong Kong Polytechnic in the area of Building Technology in the 1970's and he migrated to Australia in 1986. In order to enhance his educational achievements, David acquired a Master Degree in Land Economics at the University of Technology, Sydney. He was later offered a scholarship to undertake further study at the University of Western Sydney where he later obtained a PhD in Economics. For 25 years, he has been a Fellow of the Australian Property Institute which has set and maintained the benchmark and standards for property professionals.

David has been involved in a variety of business engagements, including building construction, real estate development, migration and tax consulting. After his retirement, he is still keen in keeping his interests in table tennis, bush walking, swimming and travelling to fulfil his bucket lists.



# **Making a Difference**

The objectives of our Association (as taken from Section 4.1 of our Association Constitutions) are

- (a) to support the goals and activities of the Hong Kong Polytechinc University (PolyU),
- (b) to promote, support and protect the common interest of the members of the Association,
- (c) to encourage and sponsor intellectual and cultural activities among the membership,
- (d) to participate in intellectual and cultural activities in the local community,
- (e) to enhance the friendship, communication and fellowship among the Association members,
- (f) to promote linkage between the Australian educational institutions and the PolyU,
- (g) to establish scholarships for Australian students/scholars to study/conduct research at the PolyU,
- (h) to establish scholarships for PolyU students/scholars to study/conduct research at an Australian institution, and
- (i) to encourage migrants from Hong Kong to integrate with the Australian community.

These objectives were devised in line with the PolyU's motto 開物成務 勵學利民 (with the English translation being to learn and to apply, for the benefit of mankind). Our Association was not established simply to connect PolyU alumni, students and staff across Australia and Hong Kong, many of our members are committed to contribute their knowledge and experience in supporting communities, for the benefit of the society and mankind.

I personally feel proud of our Association as we have been able to accomplish most of these objectives to some extent (except objectives (g) and (h), but some scholarships had been offered to PolyU students by individual members).

We have many life members who are well known community leaders in Australia, such as Hugh Lee OAM, Philip Chui, Joseph Yu, Vincent Yu, Dr. Anthony Cheung, Michael Tse, Henry Au, Paulus Ng, Raymond Pau, and many more. Some of them are/were Presidents of communities including the United Chinese Commerce Association of Australia (澳洲中華總商聯合會), the Eastwood Chinese Senior Citizens Club (依士活華人高齡會), the Elderly Chinese Australian Homes (EACH/新州華人安老之家), and the Hong Kong Club Victoria (維省香港會), just to mention a few.

Our life member Prof. Philomena Leung who was previously Associate Dean (International) of Macquarie University is currently Director of the Institute of Public Accountants (Australia). Another life member Dr. Daniel Sze, a popular herbal medicines scientific consultant and educator, had held many talks about medical research and disease prevention on the Chinese radio and at other community venues. Both Philomena and Daniel are PolyU graduates, renowned scholars in their fields, and had been lecturers of the PolyU and other universities in Australia. Another renowned scholar and clinician in mental health is Prof. Yip Kam-Shing who had worked at the PolyU for over 30 years. There are also other scholars and past PolyU professors and lecturers in our members list.

I myself had also been an Executive Committee Member of the Australian Chinese Community Association of NSW (ACCA, 紐省澳華公會) and was the longest-serving committee member of the International Guolin Qigong (Australia) Association (國際郭林氣功文化研究會澳洲分會), from 2009 till 2022.

Besides supporting PolyU's development, our Association had also raised funds and made donations on several occasions for a good cause. We had successfully raised funds to help victims of Boxing Day tsunami, Sichuan earthquake and Victoria bush fire, and made donations to RIDCB (Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children), CPA (Chinese Parents Association – Children with Disabilities) and DAPA (Differently Abled People Association). More recently in March this year. we had donated to the Australian Red Cross in response to their Queensland and New South Wales Floods Appeal.

Our Association also works closely with the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office Sydney (香 港駐悉尼經濟貿易辦事處) and we encourage our members to support their organised activities. On two occasions - the dupliCITY (映双城) Exhibition, a photo exhibition by Polytechnic Design graduate Alex Ma in 2012 and the "Chinese Painting with Love" artwork exhibition by Cammy Chan in 2017 were both organised by our Association with the exhibitions held at Hong Kong House, a venue provided by HKETO.

Lastly, some members of our Association had also participated in joint functions with the alumni associations of the Hong Kong University (NSW Chapter), the Chinese University of Hong Kong (NSW) and the Hong Kong Baptist University on many occasions.



#### **Past Publications**

The very first publication of our Association was a booklet handed out to participants attending the inauguration ceremony and dinner of our Association in October 2002. Since then, we had published an annual booklet every year from 2003 up to 2018. In the early years besides the annual booklets, we also published regular newsletters about two to three times a year to announce PolyU news and upcoming events, and to report on past events. In those days we sent the newsletters via email to our members, when Facebook, WhatsApp and other social media were not yet in use. Nowadays our main communication amongst members is via WhatsApp and Facebook, although sometimes we could use email, WeChat or SMS messages to communicate with some individuals who do not use WhatsApp.

Bosco Lau has been the publication officer and chief editor of almost all our past publications. Some of the covers of past booklets were designed by Bosco and the late Chan Kit-Man. 


2008 Edition Total 50 pages

Professor Yip is a renounced international scholar and clinician in mental health practice and clinical social work practice.



He immigrated to Australia with his family in 1985 and has spent more than 35 years in Australia, engaging in various business trading enterprises and Media business together with his great personality to serve the Victoria community in different business associations and social clubs for his valuable contributions.

Mr. Chui has served as the Chairman of Chinese Fellowship of Victoria and Chinese Fellowship Chinese School over the years which promote Victoria Chinese community services and Chinese Language education in achieving high personal accolades and excellent student results in VCE Chinese language.

In 1997, Mr. Chui accompanied the student and school principal to the Victoria Government House receiving an award of the Highest Achievement Award of the Year in VCE Chinese Language first prize.

Thereafter the enterprise business has expanded and diversified, including weekly and annual published magazines, website designs, printing and media promotion services. This year Asian Multimedia even joins with New Silk Road to organize model competition and Flower Age Cheongsam Talent Competition, to be held in 2023.

In 2015 Asian Multimedia Enterprise celebrated its 18<sup>th</sup> anniversary with the first Golden Talents Contest for all Chinese entrants between 10 to 80 years old in their musical talents, with the Final Contest held in a dinner party of 500 people. The Golden Talents Contest has since become an annual popular music event in Victoria.

# How does Guolin Qigong enhance our bodily health?

I came into the International Guolin Qigong Culture Research (Australia) Association from a complementary perspective – the evidence-based angle. I am interested to seek the evidence to answer this question – if Qigong works, then show us the proof!

In China as well as many parts of Asia, many cancer patients have used different forms of Qigong as a complementary health-enhancing exercise together with the main-stream chemotherapy or radiotherapy. Some patients practice Qigong after the surgical operations to remove the main bulk of malignant tumours. Guolin Qigong is one of the popularly used forms of Qigong in China. (Sze et al, 2014).

It has been claimed by many people including many Qigong masters and supervisors that there are genuine clear improvements in the health of the cancer patients. However, since all these are individual cases -- just like many dots on a paper, and no one has joined all these dots together to make it a continuous line. And we need to further combine these lines into a picture. As the Scientific advisor of this Association, I am working as the artist to join all these dots together to make a line, to make a complete picture eventually.

In my profession as a Laboratory Medicine Scientist and Cancer Immunologist, I am working in Australia across the two cities of Sydney and Melbourne as a research scientist to work closely together with many other medical doctors, scientists, volunteers, qigong masters, and patients etc to make the evidence possible. So that a clear picture whether qigong has really an impact on the health of the cancer patients in a positive and significant way.

Two very good research studies conducted in Sydney have reported about the use of a 10-week practice of Medical Qigong (MQ) intervention in comparison with the control group. It was demonstrated with statistical significant clinical benefits as shown in 162 cancer patients' self-reported chronic fatigue, Quality of Life, and reduction of the inflammatory marker C-reactive Protein (CRP) in blood samples (Oh et al 2010; 2012). These research studies were collaborations between the Department of Medicine & School of Psychology at the University of Sydney and the Dana Faber Cancer Institute at the Harvard Medical School USA.

The question unanswered is how the reduction of CRP leads to better health? Or this is just a marker to show that the inflammation in the patients has been lowered. Is the CRP reduction simply just a reflection of the symptom or the current bodily condition, instead of being the root reason explaining how qigong helps to enhance the bodily health. The researchers of these studies commented in the paper, the researcher Oh, who lives in Sydney said in their 2010 paper that:

"While the precise mechanism through which the MQ is able to decrease inflammation is unclear, one possible pathway is through MQ's effect on the immune system... These findings indicate a need for further research on the impact of MQ on biological changes, such as immune function, cytokines and inflammation, in order to fully understand more these effects."

In 2001, my research group at the Sydney's Royal Prince Alfred Hospital published in the Journal Blood about the finding of the most potent immune cell type in our body – the dendritic cell (DC) [just like a 5-Star General in the Army] becomes dysfunctional (i.e., not working that well) as the cancer stage progresses. This is due to high level of some blood circulating proteins called Interleukin (IL)-10 and transforming growth factor  $\beta 1$  (TGF $\beta$ ) secreted by the cancer cells and other suppressive immune cells (Brown et al 2001). The good news is that restoration of the DC functionality is possible! It is through another 2 blood circulating proteins called IL-12 and gamma interferon (Brown et al, 2004).

As supporter and friends of Guolin Qigong, you would be most surprised that nearly 20 years ago, there was a study conducted in the University of Hong Kong in 2001 about cytokines change from 19 healthy people who practise Guolin Qigong daily after 14 weeks. Brian Jones, an immunologist working in the Queen Mary Hospital at that time recruited 19 healthy people and found that there is an increased gamma interferon: IL-10 ratio from 19 healthy people who practise Guolin Qigong daily after 14 weeks! That means higher level of "good" cytokine and lower level of "bad" cytokine. This can be taken as initial evidence of enhanced adaptive immunity in relation to Qigong practice for cancer patients. But the number of subjects in this study is too low and the positive results have not been validated in other studies and in other countries.

Now I am working in the RMIT University in Melbourne Australia. I have decided to follow up these preliminary scientific results together - just like joining all dots, and the lines together. We will measure the changes in patients' immunity level by measuring the number and functionality of various blood DC subsets and the changes of the blood cytokine profile (in particularly the levels of IL-10 & TGF-beta versus IL-12 and Interferon gamma.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the International Guolin Qigong Culture Research (Australia) Association in donating A\$8,000 in 2018. From 2017 onwards, we have received about \$35,000 with a target of \$100,000 for this important project. I will continue to inform you about the progress of this important and meaningful Qigong & Immunity Cancer Research Project! Your continuous support in this is much appreciated.

### Special Message from Dr. Daniel Sze (November 2022)

親愛的香港理工大學校友:

我是 Daniel。我現在已經放下我從前的大學教師工作,成為一名福音工作者 (First Nations Gospel Worker)。作為一名基督徒,回應了上帝的呼召,愛護和關心我們周圍在澳大利亞的原住民,及與他們分享耶穌基督福音的好消息。

我是華澳浸信會 West Ryde 會友。我自從 1994 年舉家離港,先到英國完成<u>免疫學博士</u>,在 1998 年繼續在澳洲悉尼及墨爾本工作及研究西方免疫抗癌。在神的帶領下,我在 2005 從西方單一化學抗癌處方藥物,轉移到多元素多靶向的傳統草藥增強免疫力研究。然後在神奇妙的安排下,我開始了澳洲土著的傳統草藥研究,並且幫助土著的族長們選擇及發展一些有商業及醫療藥用價值的傳統植物。我的教育學博士學位是研究不同文化背景的學生如何學習得優秀。

原來神是在預備我的背景及技能來愛及照顧祂的不同族類。在 2020 年當我有近半年時間 困在墨爾本 COVID-19 全市的封鎖沒辦法回悉尼和家人團聚,神的呼召臨到我:「不單單 是關心土著的健康及財富,而是要關心他們整體,包括靈性的需要,聽到福音好訊息」。 我順服神的帶領,也愛澳洲土著民族。2020底放下了大學的工作,進入 Morling College 浸 信會神學院預備自己作澳洲土著宣教。 現在我已經順利完成了 Morling 學院的神學培訓, 從 2022 七月開始成為「澳大利亞浸信會差會」"Baptist Mission Australia" 候任宣教士 Gospel Worker 為澳大利亞原住民服務和分享福音 (First Nations Gospel Ministry).

從以下三個數據比較大家就會明白澳洲土著相比其他澳洲人在生活及需要上有多大差異:

根據澳洲統計署 2021 年 6 月 30 日資料:

- (1) 非土著的平均年紀是38歲,但是土著只是20歲。
- (2) 非土著平均壽命是82歲,但是土著的只是60歲。
- (3) 土著成年人雖只佔澳洲人口 2.2%,但是關在監倉裏的土著,居然佔全體成年犯人的 30%,也就是多了 15 倍。主耶穌吩咐我們去愛鄰舍,不要忘記或疏忽那些在我們身邊 的澳洲土著---他們「餓了、渴了、作客旅、赤身露體、病了、或在監裡」(馬太福音 25:31-46)。當我們跨洋過海居住在澳洲這大地上,是否這些澳洲土著及當中的基督徒 領袖,就是「弟兄中一個最小的」?



從 2022 年七月開始的宣教事工包括 對 NSW 十著福音領袖作門徒訓練, 也會將城市裡不同文化背景的移民教 會的愛心及福音資源,透過「澳洲土 著短宣 | 帶到土著人口密度高的鄉 鎮。實踐主耶穌吩咐我們的大使命, 也同時關愛「弟兄中一個最小的」。

# (一) 感恩

無論你是否有宗教信仰或身在何處,只要你能平安健康,有關心你的親友,能樂在當下,就應該經常感恩,多謝上天 (或主)和關心及幫助過你的所有人。我們能在澳洲安居,和家人和睦,知己朋友滿天下,已覺得生活很幸福。太太和我今年 10 月去過歐洲地中海坐豪華郵輪,暢遊包括有萄葡牙、西班牙、北非摩洛哥和英屬直布羅陀等地。今回雖然是我們第四次坐郵輪遊地中海,仍然獲益及感受良多。

## (二) 安居樂業

安居樂業是做人安樂的基本條件。在澳洲我們大多已擁有一間安全及舒適的房屋,就算未完全擁有或只是租來的房屋,只要你住得滿意的話已算安居,業可以是職業或事業,如果你滿意你現時的職業可以樂業,但任何職業你都會有失落或退休的一天。你也可以發展事業,包括可賺錢和貼錢的事業(例如慈善事業)。如果你擁有好的及可持續發展的事業,也可以樂業。如果你能夠將個人興趣轉化在你的成功事業中就更完滿。

## (三) 利人利己

我們做人的宗旨應該是要利人利己,最好是幫到別人,也能幫到自己,但出發點是要 先利人,絕非利己才利人。做人最忌是做損人利己的事,而利人損己 (明知自己能力未 及硬去幫人) 也不太理智。亦有人會不聞不問,有好的消息也不會通知別人,我不會跟 隨他們,但我都要很小心我傳開的資訊是正確的而非以訛傳訛。

# (四) 自強不息

自強不息有兩個意思。自強可以指不斷進步自己,學習新的事物。我個人絕對同意就算是長者也應該持續學習,我由於要持續發展事業,自己要不續學習運用新科技去做生意。理大舉辦活齡學院 (Institute of Active Ageing),也是希望幫助到較年長者也可以入讀大學,甚至考取到證書或學位。我本人近幾年也報讀過 Monash University 在網上提供的一些營養學課程,以提升自己在這方面的知識。

自強亦可以指自我強身健體。現時經過 COVID-19 一疫,大家都已多注重家居和個人衛生清潔,均衡飲食,和適量的做運動及休息等。只可惜還有不少人忽畧了家中食水和空氣潔淨的重要性。很多人以為只要將自來水煮沸過便可以安心飲用,但忽畧了自來水中可以含有鉛和其他金屬、添加了的氟混和其他雜質而產生的有害物、和暴雨及洪水影響水質的問題。其實要保證家中有潔淨的水和空氣,只需添置有效的水和空氣淨化機,花費不會太多,已可以給自己和家人健康多一些保障,何樂而不為?

再提醒大家每年都要做身體健康檢查,有病仍需就醫,及儘量減少不必要的生活壓力。 多聯絡親人和朋友,間中去旅遊散心也是好事。如果身體有不適或已年長,就應該減少 做要勞動力的工作和家務,盡可請人代勞。



## (五) 樂活人生

最後,送給大家的四個字就是樂活人生,要健康快樂地過活直至人生的盡頭。如果可以活到 84 歲 (現時澳洲人的平均壽命歲數)屬於正常,若能活到 90 多歲甚至過百歲更好,到時至少四代同堂,可喜可賀。

有些人很有錢和長壽,也不一定可以樂活人生。例如有人長期患病依賴食藥和做手術以維持生命。太依賴食藥而非利用天然的方法 (例如均衡飲食和適量進食一些天然營養補充品) 去改善身體,會引起對身體很多不良副作用,醫生會不斷加藥或加大藥劑量,最終只會成為長期病患者,以「藥」活人生。我明白有很多人都長期食藥,但若同時進食有效的天然營養補充食品,最少藥劑量有機會不必加大,或甚至可以減藥。

另外有些有錢人長命也不快樂,例如香港有不少富豪,雖長命但仍然坦心家族生意的 發展和家人爭產的問題。

因此我認為健康、長壽和財富都只是樂活人生的部份,其他重要的因素還包括家庭、知己朋友、自由和你做人及人生意義等。

我的「樂活人生」可以用8個F來說明:



### 後記

我很快已到70歲,一般人會稱之為高齡或說人生七十古來稀。但對我來說,未來10年才會是我和太太事業的黃金期。原因是我們所發展的事業,在疫症期間仍有可觀的增長,公司稳守直銷業的全球第一位(以全球百多個國家和地區生意總額計算)。亦證明公司銷售的產品大有需求,還有大量人加入了這個直銷行業爭取機會發展個人事業。再加上現時香港居民有很多或會移民澳洲、紐西蘭、英國、美加等地。除澳紐和香港市場外,我們的事業在其他海外市場亦有起動。現時差不多每天都有本地或海外朋友找我們查詢如何參加或推薦親友參加澳紐、英國、香港甚至美加市場發展這個事業。每月我們都有幾十個 Zoom 敘會,和世界各地的生意夥伴傾談業務發展和分享用產品心得,不亦樂乎。

### **Bosco's Love for Music and Writing**

I (Bosco) had developed a habit of writing since my primary school days. I wrote picture story books in those days. At secondary school in Hong Kong, I learnt to play the guitar, and often played with some senior students at the school. From about F. 4, I had developed a habit of studying at home while listening to music on the radio, and in those days radio stations primarily played English pop songs by international artists and some local artists. I devised my own weekly Top 40 pop song charts and shared them with my friends.

While studying at the HKTC then Polytechnic, I was hired for a paid job to write course notes and devise model questions and answers for the mathematics subject (in accordance with syllabus set for the HK Secondary School Examination) by an educational institute which sells these materials to secondary school students through mail orders. After graduation from the Hong Kong Polytechnic, I was offered a job by the Polytechnic as a part-time evening lecturer to teach computer subjects for evening students. In those years many of my students were actually older than me.

During my IT career in Hong Kong, I wrote numerous project and systems specifications, I had also drafted many proposals, contracts and even tender documents while working as an IT manager. No wonder I was the top student in my MBA class when many of the courses were assessed through written assignments (I received the Award for Academic Excellence alongside the MBA degree).

Cecilia and I started building our network marketing business in Hong Kong from the early 1980s. After we had built the business to a leaders level, I started issuing regular newsletters to our group business partners, with contents about business building, product usage, and most importantly recognition of achievers. In the early days these newsletters were printed and mailed out. I have not stopped doing that ever since, but the newsletters (some in English and others in Chinese) are now being sent out by email or WhatsApp. I could be the only leader in this business who is still doing regular newsletters to partners (thousands of them nowadays) for so many years. I think younger generations may prefer receiving Facebook messages and Instagram videos instead. I could be too old-fashioned and may need to explore what communication means should be adopted for moving the business forward.

In 2016 I wrote an article titled "When I'm Sixty-Four" with an A-to-Z section describing 26 music artists (with their names starting from A to Z) that I love. I also wrote various articles on different music genres/artist groups with an A-to-Z section in each (e.g., A-to-Z artists, A-to-Z songs, etc.), covering British Invasion music, Australian pop music, classical rock songs, disco hits, Motown music, movie theme songs and soundtracks, Hong Kong English pop music, instrumental hits, Christmas songs, one-hit wonders, love songs, and family groups, etc. I had also written articles focusing on song titles, such as songs with repeated words in title, songs related to animals/body parts/colours/flowers and plants/food and drinks/numbers/transportation and vehicles/world cities/boy names/girl names, etc. Extracts of some of them have been published in various booklets. I have also been sharing their contents with audience of the 2RRR radio program "Enjoy Yourself Today". My goal is to complete 100 articles by 2023. After that, I would focus on reviewing and updating the lot.

Through my love (and almost an addiction) for music and writing, I hope that I can constantly exercise my brain and better avoid dementia and related brain diseases.
