Subject Synopsis/ Indicative Syllabus	1. Preparatory workshops  Two workshops, namely "Administrative Briefing" and "Service Overview" are provided. Related policies and procedures of fieldwork practice are introduced in the workshop of "Administrative Briefing". The workshop of "Service Overview" covers a range of social services in Hong Kong. Students are able to acquire an understanding of the general provision of the services in Hong Kong, the characteristics of the service users and the intervention approaches that are commonly adopted by the frontline practitioners.					

#### 2. Integrative workshop

A workshop is organized in the middle of the fieldwork placement to review students' achievement and barriers in fieldwork and to deepen their knowledge and skills required for service termination.

## 3. Enhancement workshop

In order to sensitize students to current social issues and prepare them for effective professional practice, students are required to attend one seminar/workshop/course related to human services provided by NGOs, academic institutions and other organizations in the community.

## Teaching/Learning Methodology

- 1. A variety of teaching methods are employed, e.g. small group discussion, role-play, structured exercise, visits, sharing of experiences by frontline practitioners and graduates.
- 2. Guided discussion are be used to promote creativity, as well as generate meaningful interaction and understanding among students.
- 3. Reflective discussion is employed to enable students to derive personal insights.
