	1. Integration of Theory & Practice						
	Fieldwork Placement provides a real service setting for students to meet with service users, understand their situations and apply learned concepts and theories to practice.						
	2. Practice of Case, Group and Community Work Skills						
	By the use of weekly supervision, live supervision and observation, students are coached by their supervisors to practice the process model of generic case, group and community work (engagement, assessment, contract and planning, intervention and termination) and the skills required.						
	3. Instilling of Professional Attitudes and Values and Service Accountability						
	Through discussions and case studies, the supervisors guide the students and help them develop a set of professional attitudes and values as well as service accountability.						
Teaching/Learning Methodology	By means of weekly supervision, live supervision and observation, students are coached by their supervisors to carry out their placement assignments. Through discussions and real case situations, the supervisors guide the students and deepen their self-understanding, professional attitudes, values, as well as service accountability. During weekly supervisory sessions, student's performance is discussed and their active participation is encouraged. At the mid-placement evaluation, the supervisors will provide verbal feedback to students. Towards the end of the placement, a formal evaluation session will be held.
