Objectives	The subject aims to enable students to develop overall competence in social work practice through exposure to real life situations and handling of assignments in agency setting.							
	For full-time social work students, this core subject is purposefully structured and organized to fulfill all the requirements of Work Integrated Education (WIE).							

Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the subject, students will be able to:

- a. develop competence in generic social work practice;
- b. relate and integrating the theory and knowledge derived from social work studies, social sciences, and supporting subjects to the field situation;
- c. examine and assimilate professional attitudes and values which affect effective functioning of the various roles of social workers;
- d. reflect on social work values and ethical principles and put them into practice; and
- e. build a sense of identity with the social work profession.

Subject Synopsis/ Indicative Syllabus

Students' assignments mainly consist of cases, groups, mass programmes or community projects, or a combination of these learning opportunities, with emphasis on direct face-to-face contact with clients, and the application of social work knowledge and concepts.

1. Integration of Theory and Practice

Fieldwork Placement provides a real service setting for students to meet with service users, understand their situations and apply learned concepts and theories to practice.

2. Practice of Case, Group and Community Work Skills

With the use of weekly supervision, live supervision and on-site observation, students are coached by their supervisors to apply the process model of generic case, group and community work (engagement, assessment, contract and planning, intervention and termination) and/or selected social work intervention models, and practice related skills.

3. Instilling Professional Attitudes and Values and Service Accountability

Through discussion and case studies, supervisors guide students to develop professional attitudes and values as well as service accountability.

Teaching/Learning Methodology

By means of weekly supervision, live supervision and observation, students are coached by their supervisors to carry out their placement assignments. Through discussions and real case situations, the supervisors guide the students and deepen their self-understanding, professional attitudes, values, as well as service accountability. During weekly supervisory sessions, student's performance is discussed and their active participation is encouraged. At the mid-placement evaluation, the supervisors will provide verbal feedback to students. Towards the end of the placement, a formal evaluation session will be held.
