Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of MSW Fieldwork II, students are able to:

- a. internalize professional values, attitudes and to enhance the effective functioning of the various roles of social workers;
- b. reflect on social problems and current issues from different perspective;
- c. develop competencies in social work practice with a specific client group and expand their knowledge base;
- d. consolidate their in-depth understanding of the needs and problems of a specific client system and develop the skills in conducting social work tasks from data collection to termination;
- e. evaluate and reflect on the constraints of concepts and theories when applying to a specific client group; and
- f. critically reflect on learning needs, supervision, and accountability in service delivery.

Subject Synopsis/ Indicative Syllabus

A student is assigned to a social service agency to carry out the roles and tasks of a student social worker and to work with cases, groups, and communities of greater complexity. They are expected to perform the followings:

- 1. internalizing the basic assumptions and values of social work;
- 2. sharpening social awareness and commitment to service;
- 3. understanding and assessing the client system, the cultural, historical and sociopolitical context and the organization;
- 4. critically examining knowledge on social welfare policies and services relevant to the placement setting;
- 5. observing, building relationship and collecting information efficiently;
- 6. assessment, formulation, intervention, termination, and evaluation being carried out with competence;
- 7. application of theories and concepts in direct practice critically;
- 8. producing relevant reports with quality; and
- 9. integrating personal self and professional self to establish the identity of a professional social worker.

Teaching/Learning Methodology

Each student is supervised by an experienced practice teacher to carry out direct practice assignments and activities in a social service setting. Students will receive regular individual and group supervision live observation and demonstration. Students are also required to submit various written works to enhance their learning experience.

Through regular supervisions, students are enabled to recognize and perform social work values in fieldwork practice, integrate and apply basic knowledge into practice, develop competence to serve people in need, make personal and contextual reflections and deepen their own self-understanding. Students are encouraged to take an active role in supervision meetings during which on-going feedback of their performance is provided.

Written evaluation will be completed by both the student and supervisor at the midstage and end of the placement. The evaluation will incorporate feedback from both the supervisor and agency staff.
