Fieldwork I

Fieldwork Hours

• 400 hours (required by SWRB)

Duration

- 9 September 2024 to 15 February 2025 (20+3 weeks)
- 5 sessions per week (4 hours per session)
- 3 weeks of Buffered Period

Fieldwork Hours

- Recommendation for Fieldwork Hours
 - 3 evening sessions on weekday + Saturday
 - Daytime Sessions (2.5 days)
- Principles of Arrangement of Hours
 - Benefits of **service recipients** and the **agency** *e.g. working hours, staffing arrangement*
 - Interest of **student**e.g. learning needs, support from professional staff
 - Fixed schedule, on regular basis
- Reserve time for orientation and preparatory workshops in the 1st week of AY 2024-2025



Common Working Hours for NGOs

- 4 hours per session
- Day Services
 - 9am to 1pm; 1pm to 5pm
 - 10am to 2pm; 2pm to 6pm
- Evening Services
 - 6pm to 9pm/10pm
- Weekends
 - Saturdays for most services
 - Sunday for some services
- Remarks
 - Some agencies observe five-day work scheme



Supervision

2 hours per week (2hrs x 20wks = 40hrs)

At least 50% of supervision hours should be on-site and 50% on individual basis

Weekly supervision hours are counted as **placement hours**





- For foundation practicum, the arrangement will mainly be based on your location preference, please indicate your preference according to home/ workplace.
- Traveling time from home/ work to the fieldwork unit is usually about an hour.
- Students who attend fieldwork in school or ICSYC settings, agency may require them to get sexual conviction record check.
- Fieldwork placement arrangement will also be based on the availability of fieldwork units, the requirements of agency, the time availability of students, service natures, and the development of service trend etc.

Preparation for the upcoming Fieldwork Placement

- Plan for any life events!!
- Be prepared to allow more time in the first month of placement, i.e. September 2024, for workshops, orientation, engagement with service users, etc.
- Discuss with your employer/ boss/ supervisor about your study plan and fieldwork to gain support from them
- Accumulate annual-leaves (AL) from your job
- Set aside Saturdays for fieldwork since most units provide services on Saturdays.
- If you could only attend fieldwork in the evenings, please note that there would be limited options for the matching. Please be prepared to attend fieldwork 3+ evening sessions during weekdays.



FAQs

May I attend all 5 sessions of fieldwork during the weekend?

I am currently working at school, annual leaves during school days are not allowed. May I attend fieldwork and fulfill all sessions only during the holiday break?

I get off from work at 17:45 everyday and am able to arrive to the placement unit at 19:00. May I attend 3 hours of placement for an evening session?

I work in Sha Tin and get off from work at 17:30. May I be arranged placement unit also in Sha Tin that requires only 30 minutes of travelling time, so I am able to attend fieldwork at 18:00.

I have accumulated more than 400 fieldwork hours in January, may I end my placement earlier?

I quit my job and am able to fully engage in fieldwork! May I accumulate more than 400 hours?

Eligibility and Application

- Students should be occupying a **full-time social work post** in a **welfare agency**.
 - Student has worked in the agency for over a year.
 - Those who are taking non-social work post in welfare agency or taking social work post in a non-welfare agency will be subjected to individual assessment
- Students could only apply for ONE attached placement during their study
- Please **indicate in CLIPS** of your intention to apply attached placement.
- Approval from agency is essential for the application.
- Students should present their plans in how they balance study and work in the *Duty Plan for Attached Placement Application (F14)* together with the submission of *Application Form (F13)*
- The application must be submitted to fieldwork coordinator before 22 March 2024, no late application will be entertained.

Principles and Criteria

- Preference is given to application in which the placement agency would provide **time-release**.
- Fieldwork assignments meet the requirements of the respective programme curriculum and level.
- Students who undertake attached placement at the working agency should work in a different unit.
 - No role conflict and confusion, as a staff member and student social worker.
 - Widen learning opportunities with new learning elements
