Subsequent to the email about <u>arrangements for learning, teaching and assessment for Semester</u> <u>One of 2021/22</u> dated 1 June 2021, the Graduate School would like to notify you of the following key issues:

# Learning and Teaching

Semester One of 2021/22 commences on <u>30 August 2021</u>, learning and teaching activities in Semester One of 2021/22 will be delivered face-to-face (f2f) and online simultaneously, i.e. in a hybrid mode. For practicums, clinical skills training, hands-on laboratory sessions, placements, training, studio sessions, field studies and the like, they will be conducted f2f. However, f2f activities may be reviewed with reference to the latest health and travel advice as issued by the HKSAR Government if the COVID-19 pandemic situation worsens significantly.

You are reminded that:

- (1) You should consult your Chief Supervisors with regard to your study plan/progress and subject registration. You are required to seek your Chief Supervisor's prior approval for subject registration.
- (2) You are required to apply for leave of absence if you need to conduct research activities overseas, e.g. present a paper at a conference, undertake field study/trip, collect data etc. Please communicate with your Chief Supervisors about your study plan before applying for the leave of absence.

# **Payment of Tuition Fee**

Please settle the tuition fees for Semester One, 2021/22 before commencing your studies regardless of the mode of classes in Semester One, 2021/22.

## **Issuance of Stipend or Assistantship**

RPg students receiving stipend should be studying in Hong Kong unless you have obtained prior approval for leave of absence. Please therefore be reminded that you need to communicate with your supervisory team closely and make appropriate arrangement (refer to point 2 under Learning and Teaching).

RPg students receiving assistantship under the Teaching Postgraduate Studentship Scheme (TPS), you must work in Hong Kong according to the side-line visa arrangement. No exceptional cases will be considered.

## Advice on travel to Hong Kong

For all RPg students who are currently outside Hong Kong, you are encouraged to return to Hong Kong in time for the start of the 2021/22 academic year. When you plan your trip, please make advance arrangements to meet the HKSAR Government's quarantine requirements (e.g. travel and accommodation arrangements). The Non-local Student Services Team under the Student Affairs Office will be providing you with support on issues which you need to know or follow when entering Hong Kong. #### Key issues for Hong Kong PhD Fellowship (HKPFS) students

For HKPFS students, as they have to follow a set of UGC policies governing research studies and residence requirements, and their application for academic/non-academic leave or deferment of study is unlikely approved unless very strong justifications are available, they are advised to commence their studies at the PolyU campus from Semester One, 2021/22. In case they have difficulty in returning to PolyU in Semester One, 2021/22, they should apply for academic/non-academic leave or deferment of study as early as possible.

#### Notes to Academic/Host Departments

As the above arrangements for learning and teaching are in place, academic departments are required to keep an updated record of the students' leave record and Chief Supervisors' approval for students' subject registration.
