	Work Integrated Education (WIE) ^	ENGL/other departments	2/3/	3	Elective

^ Students can apply for counting the WIE, if carried out in an European country or context, as an elective for fulfilling the credit requirements. Completed application form AR147(a) should be submitted to the Minor-offering department (Minor Department) for approval and no later than your applying for graduation. In addition:

- Only credit bearing WIE (with a subject code) will be accepted.
- The WIE duration, should be a minimum of 60 working hours.
- Only students who have already passed the WIE and meet all the specified criteria can apply the counting of WIE as elective.
- Maximum one WIE can be counted towards the minor.
- A maximum of 3 WIE credits will be counted towards the Minor.
- The Minor will follow the WIE level indicated by the Major department.
- The grade of WIE (regardless whether it is a Merit/Pass/Fail or a letter grade) would not be counted towards the calculation of the Minor GPA, despite the double-counting of the credits.

#GEC1C40 Invitation to Western Philosophical Thinking, has been changed in title and subject code, with the approval of the CoGUR, as GEC1C46 Aspects of Western Philosophy.

#ENGL3021 Understanding European Trade and Cultural Expansionism, has been changed in title and subject code, with the approval of the WG, as ENGL3030 Introduction to the History of Europe: a Trade Perspective.

Remarks: ENGL1C09 Understanding Comics: Culture and Art is deleted from the minor list with effect from the academic year 2019-20. ENGL2A08 To love, or not to love – Understanding human relationships through literary texts is deleted from the minor list with effect from the academic year 2020-21. Students who have already taken and passed these subjects can still fulfill the minor requirement.

ENGL3039 European Sociolinguistics (Subject to approval) is an alternative compulsory subject to the Minor in European Studies programme *en bloc*, with effect from Semester 2, 2023/24. The subjects highlighted in blue are subject to the WGIDS' approval for implementation from Semester 2, 2023/24.
