		(2) 57 credits by completing at least 19 subjects (including 3 credits of Chinese DSLR subject, 21 credits of compulsory subjects, and 33 credits of electives) offered by LST.
		Students who choose this academic pathway must earn 21 level-4 credits from BAEAL plus 21 level-4 credits from BALT. Double Major students will be exempted from taking WIE and CAR subjects of the second Major.
