Subject: Arrangements for Summer Term and the outstanding face-to-face activities for subjects offered in Semester 2, 2019/20

Dear Students

Subsequent to the Notice from the President dated 9 April 2020, the Senior Management has decided that subjects offered in the Summer Term (i.e. 22 June to 1 August 2020) shall be delivered generally in the form of online teaching. As there are students who strongly favour face-to-face teaching, these online lectures in the Summer Term shall be delivered in the timetabled venues (e.g. lecture theatre) according to the announced class timetable. Students who wish to attend face-to-face classes could come to the timetabled venues and attend the classes in real time. Those students who choose to learn online can however continue learning online as they did in Semester 2 of this academic year.

Notwithstanding the above, we wish to draw to your attention on a list of subjects the learning outcome of which cannot be achieved solely by online learning, and requires mandatory face-to-face activities (e.g. practicum, clinical skills training, hands-on laboratory, studio sessions and so on) and/or on-campus invigilated examinations (please click [here](#) for details). In other words, you will be required to be physically present in Hong Kong if you enroll for these subjects in Summer Term.

Besides, some Departments will make use of the Summer Term to carry out those outstanding face-to-face activities for certain subjects offered in Semester 2 (please click [here](#) for details). Students who have already enrolled for these subjects in Semester 2 are required to be present in Hong Kong for completion of these subjects. Please also take this requirement into account on your total study load, when registering for additional subjects offered in the Summer Term.

We hope the above shall facilitate you to make an informed choice in subject registration, as well as to make early preparations (e.g. planning your trips to Hong Kong and reserve your accommodation for Summer Term) when continuing your study in PolyU.
