Integrated Approach for "Point-Line-Plane" Built Heritage Conservation in Hong Kong

Like many cities, Hong Kong has long been struggled through arguments between heritage conservation and urban development. Promoting heritage conservation is crucial for the city not just for tourism but also for cultural identity, urban sustainability and economic development. Especially in Hong Kong, the conservation targets are primarily individual historic buildings ("point") because of the multi-nature of heritage conservation and complexities of land administration in Hong Kong. Funded by Built Heritage Conservation Fund (HKSAR), this research study aims to identifying the deficiencies of the conservation measures using "Point" and "Line" approaches and providing complete explanations of each of the key criteria needed to be considered for extending the scope of works into integrated "Point-Line-Plane" approach.

This public forum will present you our latest research findings and provide several recommendations to the conservation practitioners how the integrated "Point-Line-Plane" can be effectively implemented in the Hong Kong built heritage conservation.
