Subject Synopsis/ Indicative Syllabus	Please discuss and finalize the topic of interest with the supervisor.				
Teaching/Learning Methodology	The main purpose of this subject is to let students do independent study on a selected topic related to discipline area. Included in such work must be an examination of primary sources (such as research papers published in refereed journals and conferences) to the greatest extent possible and the presentation of results and conclusions in a scholarly fashion. Secondary sources and text books should not be the sole basis of the study. The study may be comparable to the literature review portions of a rigorous research project. In fact, it is expected that a student will take this Independent Study subject preceding, and as preparation for the Project subject. In summary, students may need to carry out the following tasks:  1. comprehensive literature review / survey / evaluation 2. proposing improvement / new solutions 3. attending related subjects  Potential supervisors should be approached for topic information. Either the supervisor or the student may propose a topic of study, subject to approval of the supervisor. The supervisor may suggest some research papers for the student as a starting reading list, but the student must learn to search for, read, and analyze relevant literature, and present the results of the study, under the guidance of the supervisor.
