On 6 July, Mrs Doris Fok Lee Sheung-lin, Assistant Director of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, Mrs Sylvia Lam, JP, Director of the Architectural Services Department, Mr Lee Kai Wing, Raymond, JP, Director of the Planning Department and Mr Wong Kit-loong, Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director of the Hong Kong Housing Society joined the symposium and shared their insights on Hong Kong's public space.

Earlier in May, JCDISI and One Bite Design Studio hosted 2 co-creation workshops to reimagine the Kowloon Park Fitness Trail and Prosperous Garden public space using user-centric design thinking methods. Participants, including children, youths, parents, elderlies and management staff, generated design concepts that were showcased in the symposium and explored possibilities on how concepts can be turned into action. 

A newly designed trolley begins street tests!

After 4 months of research and development with active participation from potential users, the public design team has finally completed the prototype of the trolley 2.0 and begun to conduct street tests. The team invited Ms Wong, a waste picker from Sheung Shui, who had actively participated in the cocreation process, to join the street test at PolyU and carefully recorded her opinions for further improvement. We are planning to publish the trolley design and street test results in September this year. Stay tuned for our latest news!

"Relocatable Housing by Modular Integrated Construction" research to address housing needs

Addressing the urgent needs for transitional social housing in HK, Dr Calvin W Luk, Project Manager of JCDISI is leading an applied research project with PolyU academia as well as building professionals including practicing architects and engineers. The research aimed to develop a prototype design of modular housing units and low-rise building system, which is fully relocatable, reusable, code-compliant and adaptable/expandable to form various occupancy configurations. Early design phase has commenced in April 2019 and is expected to be completed in Q1 2020.
