Geospatial Education Forum

Designing an academic programme for students wishing to follow a career in the geospatial domain is a daunting task and presents many challenges to teachers. The current trend is for an academic programme to pick a focus area and minimise or even ignore the presence of other topics with the result that graduates see only a limited part of the geospatial domain. The goal of the Geospatial Education Forum is to draw together educators from a range of constituent disciplines to identify critical limitations to their academic programmes and to propose a New Geospatial Curriculum (NGC) that will produce widely knowledgeable geospatial graduates.

The workshop is primarily designed for tertiary-level teachers involved in Geospatial Education. However, by establishing a
