| Objectives | This course focuses on strengthening existing knowledge and developing students' production skills. In particular, it will give students the grammar and vocabulary to talk about their wishes and feelings, and answer adequately to those of others. It will focus on mastering past tenses to express oneself with accuracy and confidence. This course will further develop students' oral communication skills, specifically in informal settings. <br> The course aims to be practical and will use authentic resources to give a true insight into Hispanic culture and Spanish. These will include: media footage (video/audio); printed and electronic media (websites/blogs/newspapers/magazines/books); events taking place in Hong Kong (exhibitions/film openings/presentations/restaurant openings); presentations and talks by Spanish speaking individuals. |

Communicate in correct and fluid Spanish (see subject syllabus below) using a range of tenses in the indicative and subjunctive modes. <br> b. Use the resources provided to increase their vocabulary and knowledge of grammatical structures. <br> c. Enhance their knowledge about Spanish speaking countries and language variations in Spain and America. <br> Category B: Additional outcomes <br> d. Develop their skills to narrate events in a logical and coherent manner (both spoken and written forms). <br> e. Work in a team. <br> f. Establish and develop contacts with other Spanish students outside of Hong Kong and be able to work together virtually. |


| Subject Synopsis/ <br> Indicative <br> Syllabus | Vocabulary and language functionality (to cover the following situations) <br> - Talk about oneself (physique, personality, skills). <br> - Talk about the body and its ailments. <br> - Express wishes. <br> - Offering opinions or help and reacting to either. <br> - Discourse management, taking the turn, interrupting and reacting adequately. <br> - Structuring a narration. <br> Grammatical content <br> - Verbs of change (ponerse/llevarse) <br> - Present tense of the subjunctive. <br> - Impersonal sentences. <br> - Past tenses (indefinido, imperfecto, pluscuamperfecto) <br> - Verbal locutions. <br> Cultural/Social content <br> - Prosody and gestures and their use in communication. <br> - Language variations. <br> - Sociolinguistic skills (inter-generation communication, attitudes towards work, politeness). <br> - Politics, travel and celebrations in various Spanish speaking countries. |
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| Teaching/Learnin g Methodology | The lecturer will: <br> - Communicate in Spanish. <br> - Present to students information on current events related to the topics being studied. <br> - Allow students to use their cognitive skills to identify the overall message transmitted through the language used and then analyse it to discover its exact meaning. <br> - Facilitate communication with other Spanish students and native Spanish speakers from Europe. <br> - Encourage the use of Spanish as the only language to be used during class. <br> In addition students will be expected to: <br> - Attend class and participate. <br> - Communicate in Spanish. <br> - Complete the exercises provided by the lecturer to practice new structures introduced in class. |
