



PolyU Language & Culture Exploration Camp (PLACE) 2018

(For local students)

PLACE is where we meet. It is a 4-day summer camp that presents a unique opportunity for secondary/high school students to experience university life at the PolyU's [Faculty of Humanities](#) (FH). Based on the two undergraduate programmes of the Faculty, namely [BA\(Hons\) in Chinese and Bilingual Studies](#) (BACBS) and [BA\(Hons\) in English Studies for the Professions](#) (BAESP), PLACE offers participants a variety of fun and practical activities and lectures that enhance your knowledge and competence in language, culture and communication. You will know what it is like being a FH student, and have plenty of opportunities to learn useful hands-on skills and knowledge about language and culture from our FH distinguished teachers in a real university environment. In 2017, the PLACE had 101 participants, including 51 Hong Kong students and 50 international students.

1. Date	17 – 20 July 2018 (Tuesday to Friday) *Local participants have the option to skip Day 4 (20 July)
2. Venue	The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Hong Kong
3. Eligibility	Secondary 4 & 5 students in the academic year 2017/18 or the equivalent
4. Medium of Instruction	All scheduled activities will be conducted in English
5. Fees	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Free admission. • Participants will be required to pay a deposit of HK\$1,000. The deposit will be refunded to the participants upon satisfactory completion of activity (i.e. attended all the scheduled activities). • No refund will be made for withdrawal. • All other costs for personal activities outside the schedule are NOT covered and are to be paid by participants themselves.
6. Meals	One breakfast and two meals will be provided from 17 to 20 July each day, mostly at one of the PolyU canteens.
7. Accommodation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A maximum of 3 nights of accommodation at the PolyU Student Halls of Residence from the night of 17 to 19 July 2018 (inclusive) will be provided to local participants. • Two/three participants will share a room.
8. Certification	The activity is non-credit bearing. A certificate of attendance will be granted to participants who attended all scheduled activities.
9. Application Method	All participants should complete the application form (https://www.polyu.edu.hk/mysurvey/index.php/794947) and upload a copy of their latest academic transcripts/grade reports
10. Application Deadline	30 April 2018
11. Application Result	The selection is based on school nomination, academic results in relevant subjects and area of interests of applicants. Applicants will receive a confirmation email before June 2018. Successful applicants will be required to pay the deposit within one week from the date of the confirmation letter.

1. Date	17 – 20 July 2018 (Tuesday to Friday) Non-local participants are expected to arrive Hong Kong and check-in the Student Halls of Residence on 16 July 2018 (Monday)
2. Venue	The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Hong Kong
3. Eligibility	Grade 12/11/10 students in the academic year 2017/18 or the equivalent
4. Medium of Instruction	All scheduled activities will be conducted in English
5. Fees	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Free admission. • Participants will be required to pay a deposit of HK\$1,000. The deposit will be refunded to the participants upon satisfactory completion of activity (i.e. attended all the scheduled activities). The credit card refund process will normally take at least two months, depending on the processing time of individual banks. • No refund will be made for withdrawal. • Successful non-local participants are required to purchase their own insurance for participating the PLACE Camp and will be required to provide proof of insurance before arrival. • Air fare to and from Hong Kong, as well as the traveling costs to and from the Hong Kong International Airport (approximate HK\$39 by bus or HK\$300 by taxi), and all other costs for personal activities outside the schedule are NOT covered and are to be paid by participants themselves.
6. Insurance	Successful non-local participants are required to purchase their own insurance for participating the PLACE Camp and will be required to provide proof of insurance before arrival.
7. Meals	One breakfast and two meals will be provided from 17 to 20 July each day, mostly at one of the PolyU canteens.
8. Accommodation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A maximum of 5 nights of accommodation at the PolyU Student Halls of Residence from the night of 16 to 20 July 2018 (inclusive) will be provided to non-local participants. • Two/three participants will share a room.
9. Visa	Non-local participants should prepare visa (if applicable) to enter Hong Kong by themselves
10. Certification	The activity is non-credit bearing. A certificate of attendance will be granted to participants who attended all scheduled activities.
