## March | Counsellor Fly-in Programme

GEO jointly hosted the six-day "HKUST x PolyU Counsellor Fly-in 2023" in late March. To strengthen the close connection between PolyU and the rest of the world, 39 counsellors from 38 schools in 15 countries and regions, namely Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Malaysia, Pakistan, The Philippines, South Korea, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and Vietnam, as well as counsellors from local schools, were welcomed at PolyU. Professor Ben Young, Vice President (Student and Global Affairs), Professor Kwok-yin Wong, Vice President (Education) and Professor Geoffrey Q. P. Shen, Associate Vice President (Global Partnerships) and Director of Global Engagement shared information about how talented students are helped to gain access to PolyU's top-quality education and dynamic learning environment. The entire fly-in programme ended with a dinner, with all parties exchanging educational experiences and expressing their hope of jointly nurturing tomorrow's leaders with a global vision.







## **April** | Junior Researcher **Mentoring Programme 2023**

PolyU first launched the Junior Researcher Mentoring Programme in 2021, with the participation of 300+ high school students from both local and local international schools. During April to August this year, a total of 136 high school students from 49 schools participated in 42 small-scale research projects led by PolyU academics from 20 schools and departments. The Programme enabled high school students to gain holistic hands-on experiences on the research process across different topics. Designed to stimulate interest in research, the Programme hopes to nurture

more young talents going forward.



## July | Summer Institute 2023

This July and August witnessed the launch of the first PolyU Summer Institute, with the support of the nine Faculties and Schools, which aimed to offer high school students a rewarding PolyU experience. Around 210 local high school students from 107 schools participated in the residential camp, taking part in a series of engaging activities and sessions where they mingled with PolyU representatives. Among the participants, 45 also took a credit-bearing course. These students gained an elementary knowledge of entrepreneurship and artificial intelligence, and learned to apply the theories to develop an innovative mindset in this digital era. The participants not only experienced our University's dynamic learning environment, but also got valuable first-hand experience of making informed choices for their future studies.



## July | International Summer School 2023

The International Summer School 2023 was held from mid-July to mid-August for around 450 undergraduate students from 18 countries and regions including PolyU students. ## **October** | International Cultural Festival

The inaugural PolyU International Cultural Festival was held in October. The Festival spanned over eleven days. It was a celebration of diverse cultures through food appreciation, cultural workshops, booth exhibitions, live performances, traditional dances, film screenings, and craft demonstrations. With an amazing attendance of over 6,000 individuals, including 40 distinguished guests from 20 countries and regions represented by the Consulates-General, among whom were 10 Consuls General, the Festival had a profound impact and created memories that will be cherished for years to come. Additionally, we secured the sponsorship of over 25 organisations, including multiple Consulates-General in Hong Kong. This remarkable event further solidified PolyU's commitment to diversity and international collaboration.



## October | Global Exchange Fair

The two-day Global Exchange Fair comprised an exhibition and four information sessions in October. With nearly 650 students in attendance, the Fair showcased the student exchange opportunities for PolyU undergraduates. Students and teaching staff were invited to share their outbound learning experiences. The exhibition booths at the Fair were hosted by enthusiastic inbound and returning exchange students, who were eager to share their amazing exchange experiences with the participants. The sessions were informative, and all of the participants had a productive and enjoyable time.







### November | Networking with Secondary School **Principals and Vice Principals**

PolyU has been developing strong relationships with local secondary schools. This year, 39 principals and vice principals from 34 local secondary schools in Yuen Long, Tuen Mun and Tai Po were invited to a luncheon meeting with PolyU representatives, followed by a guided tour of various faculties, departments and schools, along with our Industrial Centre. The participants learned more about PolyU's latest developments. the features of our 4-year undergraduate programmes and the dynamic learning environment.





## **Outgoing Delegation Visits**

## **February** | Belgium, Czech and Germany

Professor Geoffrey Q. P. Shen, Associate Vice President (Global Partnerships) and Director of Global Engagement, and Associate Dean (FB) Dr Xin Xu, joined Professor Ben Young, Vice President (Student and Global Affairs) and paid a visit to the Group T Leuven campus on 20 February to explore new collaboration opportunities, and later visited two other partner universities – Czech Technical University and Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München. During the meetings, all of the parties expressed interest in strengthening ties and deepening collaborations.



## September | Australia

President Teng was invited to participate in a Presidents' Forum at The University of Sydney on 25 September to engage in roundtable discussions with presidents of world-leading universities on university leadership and other emerging challenges encountered by the higher education sector.

Professor Christopher Chao, Vice President (Research and Innovation), joined the visit and met with the representatives of the University of Adelaide and the University of Technology Sydney. There was also mutual interest in exploring the opportunities to offer joint programmes at master's and doctoral levels, or identifying areas for collaborative research. In addition, Professor Christopher Chao paid a courtesy visit to UNSW Sydney.





## April | South Korea

Led by the Council Chairman, a delegation comprising Professor Jin-Guang Teng, President of PolyU, and Professor Ben Young, visited three partner universities and an international school in South Korea from 18 to 20 April. The university visits included high-level meetings with Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology, Seoul National University, and Yonsei University. President Teng shared the University's latest developments and achievements. The PolyU delegation also paid a visit to Seoul International School. A Korean undergraduate student joined to share her PolyU experience with prospective students.



## November | The UK

Professor Wing-tak Wong, Deputy President and Provost, led a delegation to visit several universities in the UK to deepen our academic partnerships. The delegation visited Imperial College London, the University of Warwick, Loughborough University and the University of Oxford between 6 and 8 November. Both parties explored further cooperation in undergraduate- and doctoral-level dual programmes. They also identified research initiatives and other educational collaborations, such as creating research opportunities for final-year undergraduates and exchanging academics or researchers.

## **Incoming Delegation Visits**

### **October** | Meeting with the Knowledge and Human Development Authority in Dubai

On 11 October, President Teng hosted a delegation from the Knowledge and Human Development Authority (KHDA) in Dubai, led by the Director General, Dr Abdulla Al Karam, who shared the Dubai Economic Agenda 'D33' and his view on the city's competitive advantages and plentiful educational opportunities. He also expressed the support of KHDA for starting PolyU programmes that are in high demand in Dubai such as business and hotel and tourism management. Both parties agreed upon the common goal of contributing to talent development in Dubai.

## **February** | Luncheon with Consulates General

On 3 February, President Teng hosted an exclusive luncheon for Consuls General and representatives from Bangladesh, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Myanmar, Pakistan, South Korea and The Philippines. During the luncheon organised by GEO and supported by all of the Deans, President Teng provided an update on the latest achievements and future development plans of the University, while Professor Ben Young shared the learning opportunities and support to students.

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## August | Breakfast Meeting with the Minister from Kazakhstan

On 17 August, President Teng hosted a breakfast meeting for Mr Sayasat Nurbek, Minister of Science and Higher Education in Kazakhstan. He was accompanied by Mr Almas Seitakynov, Consul General of the Republic of Kazakhstan in Hong Kong and Macao. Mr Nurbek shared the Ministry's latest development plan, its support for opening foreign university branches in Kazakhstan, and his country's strategic focus in technical fields to enhance cooperation in education, research and innovation. They had a fruitful discussion about collaboration on various fronts, including initiatives of mutual interest to be launched in Kazakhstan.

# The University Social Responsibility Network (USRN)

The University Social Responsibility Network (USRN) was initiated by PolyU in 2015 in the belief that universities have an obligation to work together to find solutions to address the economic, social and environmental challenges facing the world today, making the world more just, inclusive, peaceful and sustainable. Serving as a global platform to connect and foster partnership among members, the USRN shares ideas and resources to develop collaborative USR projects with varied scope and scale, advancing higher education as a catalyst for social change through education, research and community service. The USRN comprises 20 member institutions with a wide geographic spread. Professor Ben Young, Vice President (Student and Global Affairs), is Chair of the USRN Executive Committee. The Network Secretariat is currently hosted at the Global Engagement Office of PolyU.

## USRN's Participation in the Global Engagement & Empowerment Forum (GEEF) 2023

On behalf of the USRN, Professor Kwok-yin Wong, Vice President (Education), spoke at the Global Engagement & Empowerment Forum (GEEF) 2023, hosted by Yonsei University on 3 February. The theme of the GEEF was "Turning Point: From Crisis into Opportunity". During the Forum, the task of achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030 was discussed in terms of current progress at the mid-point, along with future directions for pursuing SDGs.

Professor Wong was invited to speak in a panel session focusing on "SDG 4: Quality Education". Moderated by Professor Donghoon Kim, Senior Vice President of Yonsei University, the session addressed the role of higher education institutions in realising a sustainable future.

## USRN Staff Development Workshop 2023: Cultivating University Communities with a Broader Mind

The USRN and one of its member institutions, VU Amsterdam, co-hosted the USRN Staff Development Workshop 2023 from 24 to 26 September. The theme was "Cultivating University Communities with a Broader Mind". This biennial USRN event brought together 36 participants from around the world, including representatives from 10 USRN member institutions: Ateneo de Manila University, Rhodes University, Sichuan University, Simon Fraser University, PolyU, The University of Manchester, Tufts University, University of Haifa, University of Iceland and VU Amsterdam. The event was also attended by representatives from four invited institutions: the International European University, Sabanci University, University Paris-Est Créteil and V.N. Karazin Kharkiv National University.

During the Workshop, the participants learned about and discussed the "Mixed Classroom Education" model, a diversity and inclusion best practice model developed by VU Amsterdam, which aims to cultivate an enriching and supportive learning atmosphere for all students, regardless of their backgrounds or abilities. The participants also had the opportunity to exchange their ideas, knowledge and experiences of building successful University Social Responsibility (USR) initiatives that can be sustained over time.

Following the Workshop, the 6th USRN Executive Committee (ExCom) meeting was hosted, in which members of the USRN ExCom gathered to discuss the future priorities and strategic foci of the Network.



## Rwanda Service-Learning Programme

From 21 July to 6 August, three students from USRN member universities, including Ateneo de Manila University, Beijing Normal University and the University of Pretoria, participated in an international Service-Learning programme organised by PolyU's Service-Learning and Leadership Office in Rwanda, Africa.

The student participants engaged in a project entitled "Habitat Green in East Africa", in which they collaborated with local students to design and implement sustainable energy solutions for families in remote villages. The main objective of the Service-Learning programme was to install solar power systems in Bicaca Village, located in Rwamagana District in Rwanda's Eastern Province. Over 14 days, the students worked diligently to address the basic electricity needs of more than 400 households in this rural mountainous region.

In addition to learning about the technical aspects of the systems, the students participating in the Programme had the opportunity to actively engage with the local community, thereby fostering collaboration and establishing meaningful connections. Their dedicated efforts brought hope and light to families in need, showcasing the transformative power of learning through service to others.

## **Belt and Road Initiatives**

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## **July** | Forum of the Belt and Road Alliance Founding Institutions

On 7 July, GEO hosted the Forum of the Belt and Road Alliance Founding Institutions, which commemorated the 10th anniversary of the Belt and Road Initiatives. Under the theme of "Jointly Building the Belt and Road", the Forum brought together 18 scholars from the founding institutions of seven Belt and Road academic alliances to share insights into fostering talent development, knowledge transfer and research development for the sustainable advancement of Belt and Road countries.

PolyU is actively developing its international networks to support the Belt and Road Initiatives. The University is not only the Co-founder and Vice-President of the University Alliance of the Silk Road but also a member of the Association of Sino-Russian Technical Universities, the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor Consortium of Universities, and the University Consortium of the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road. To further strengthen our presence in and strategic development of the Belt and Road, PolyU joined the Alliance of International Science Organisations in the Belt and Road Regions and ASEAN-China Network for Cooperation and Exchanges among Engineering and Technology Universities as a member institution in 2023.

### **Belt and Road Academic Exchange**

PolyU has built robust partnerships with Belt and Road tertiary institutions, to enhance academic exchange and mobility programmes in the regions. The Sub-Committee on Belt and Road Development, chaired by Professor Geoffrey Q. P. Shen, Associate Vice President (Global Partnerships) and Director of Global Engagement, was established under the purview of the Global Engagement Committee. The aim is to make significant progress in fostering strategic partnerships, promoting academic exchange, and facilitating collaborative research projects with institutions along the Belt and Road. As part of our commitment to the Belt and Road Initiatives, GEO launched a two-year pilot Belt and Road Funding Scheme to promote knowledge exchange and talent mobility in the regions.


