Dear all new Research Postgraduate students

A warm welcome to The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. In order to better prepare you to embark on your research postgraduate study in Hong Kong, the Graduate School would like to remind you of the following key issues:

Learning and Teaching

Please refer to the announcement from Vice President (Education) on <u>Arrangements for Learning</u>, <u>Teaching and Assessment (LTA) for Semester Two</u>, <u>2022/23</u>. You are also required to observe the latest arrangement on LTA announced by the University from time to time.

- 1) You should consult your Chief Supervisors with regard to your study plan. For subject registration, Chief Supervisor's prior approval must be sought before any subject registration. Please refer to the Academic Registry website for the <u>details</u> and <u>guide</u> for subject registration.
- 2) All new Research Postgraduate (RPg) students are required to undergo a <u>Research Language Skills</u>
 <u>Assessment (RLSA)</u>. The English Language Centre (ELC) will notify you of the RLSA arrangement in due course.

Please note that you will be informed of the RLSA result in Semester Two so that you would know if you will be required to take English enhancement subject(s). You are advised to enroll in the English enhancement subject(s) only after obtaining the result of the RLSA.

ELC will arrange the result announcement within eight weeks after the test.

Report Commencement of Study

All new RPg students are required to report your commencement of study at the General Office of your host departments/schools on or before 3 January 2023. When reporting at the General Office of the host department/school, you must present a student card issued by the Academic Registry and an activated valid visa (if applicable). New RPg students who are scholarship holders will only receive stipend for the entire

month of January 2023, upon your reporting commencement of study at PolyU in Hong Kong by the specified date above.

If you have genuine difficulty, you may defer the commencement of study to the start of Summer Term of 2022/23 (1 May 2023), the latest, subject to the prior agreement of the host department/school.

Advice on Travel to Hong Kong

For all RPg students who are currently outside Hong Kong, you are encouraged to arrive in Hong Kong in time for the start of Semester Two, 2022/23. When you plan your trip, please make advance arrangements to meet the latest <u>Health Quarantine Arrangements on Inbound Travellers</u> as imposed by the HKSAR Government. For non-local students who require to activate student visa or other visas in order to study in Hong Kong, please be aware of the lead time for activation of visa by the Hong Kong Immigration Department.

Notes to Hong Kong PhD Fellowship (HKPFS) Students

For HKPFS students, you have to follow a set of UGC policies governing research studies and residence requirements. As your application for academic/non-academic leave or deferment of study is unlikely approved unless supported by very strong justifications, you are advised to commence your study at the PolyU campus from Semester Two, 2022/23. In case you have difficulty in coming to PolyU in Semester Two, 2022/23, you should apply for academic/non-academic leave or deferment of study as early as possible.

Notes to Academic/Host Departments

As the above arrangements for learning and teaching are in place, academic departments are requested to keep an accurate record of new RPg students' commencement date in Hong Kong and Chief Supervisors' approval for students' subject registration.
