

Briefing Note on Government Subsidy

(Sponsored by Education Bureau)

This briefing note is prepared for PolyU students and Academic Units submitting Individual Application or Group Application respectively for the **2019-20** *IAO Study Abroad Fund (SAF)*. Government Subsidy is available to eligible students undertaking 2019-20 SAF funded activities. Please read carefully the details below and make application to Government Subsidy as appropriate.

- 1. Scheme for Subsidy on Exchange (SSE)
- 2. Scheme for Means-tested Subsidy on Exchange to "Belt and Road" Regions (Means-tested SSEBR)

Non-means-tested Subsidies on Exchange to "Belt and "Road" Regions (Non-means-tested SSEBR)



Eligibility Criteria

Means-tested Schemes

Eligibility

- Local student with a Hong Kong Identity Card and enrolled in full-time undergraduate programme; and
- Recipient of grant under the Tertiary Student Finance Scheme Publicly-funded Programmes by Student Finance Office; OR Your family member is a recipient of the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA)

1. Scheme for Subsidy on Exchange (SSE)

- Participate in an outbound learning activity in any region for at least 14 days
- SSE is available once throughout the undergraduate studies

2. Scheme for Means-tested Subsidy on Exchange to "Belt and Road" Regions (Means-tested SSEBR)

- Participate in an outbound learning activity in a "<u>Belt and Road</u>" Regions (except Chinese mainland, Taiwan and Macau) for at least 5 days
- Means-tested SSEBR is available twice at most at two different "Belt and Road" regions, subject to maximum amount of subsidy to be received, i.e. HK\$60,000, discounted by level of student finance approved by the Student Finance Office (SFO).

Non-means-tested Scheme

Eligibility

 Local student with a Hong Kong Identity Card and enrolled in full-time undergraduate programme

Non-means-tested Subsidies on Exchange to "Belt and Road" Regions (Non-means-tested SSEBR)

- Participate in an outbound learning activity in any "<u>Belt and Road</u>" Region (except Chinese mainland, Taiwan and Macau) for at least 5 days
- Non-means-tested SSEBR is available once throughout the undergraduate studies.



Subsidy Amount

Means-tested Schemes

- 1. Scheme for Subsidy on Exchange (SSE)
- 2. Scheme for Means-tested Subsidy on Exchange to "Belt and Road" Regions (Means-tested SSEBR)

The amount of Government Subsidy is calculated by applying the approved level of student finance to the maximum level of subsidy based on the latest available application result from Student Finance Office (SFO). The amount of financial level will be adjusted upward to 50% if the level of student finance approved by SFO is lower than 50%.

How to apply?

2019-20 SAF Individual Applicant

 Students to indicate the selection of type of Government Subsidy through online application form.

2019-20 SAF Group Application

 Academic unit hosting the Group activity to collect the preference of students on the type of Government Subsidy to apply for.

For students who are eligible and wish to apply for **Means-tested Schemes** for the 2019-20 SAF funded activities, approval letter from the Student Finance Office (SFO) is required. Such letter shall be submitted either (1) through the online application made by Individual Applicants, or (2) to Academic Units as the host of Group activity.
