Background

Cyberport University Partnership Programme (CUPP) supported by Cyberport Creative Micro Fund (CCMF) has nurtured over 500 talents in 90+ teams since 2015. It is a life-changing training plus competition programme for local university teams to unleash their full potential and gain global market insights




Nomination Eligibility & How to Apply

- Promoting CUPP 2026 among university from mid Jan - 9 March 2025
- Nominate eligible and potential teams to participate in CUPP 2026
 - **Period Open for Nomination:** 15 Jan - 9 Mar 2026
 - **Deadline for nomination:** 9 March 2026
- A maximum of 10 teams from each university
- Co-organising Universities are required to submit the nomination **by email by 9 Mar 2026** using the nomination template, which will be provided by Cyberport.

CUPP 2026 Nomination Eligibility

- Project must be rooted in digital tech and focus on **AI, Blockchain, Cybersecurity and Data Science**.
- Applicants must be **between 18 to 30 years old (inclusive)** upon the nomination deadline (**i.e. 9 Mar 2026**).
- Applicants must be current undergraduate, postgraduate students or graduates nominated by the co-organising universities.
- Applicants must have a good command of English.
- Team members could be joined from the same or other CUPP co-organising universities.
- Each team could have up to 5 members with suggested team structure as follow:
 - 1 Team Leader (i.e. principal applicant) must be Hong Kong ID card holder, the main contact person of the team, and he/she must be joining Boot Camp.
 - Up to 2 Core Team Members with technical/UIUX knowledge, who will be joining Boot Camp;
 - Up to 2 Supporting Team Members, who will **NOT** be joining Boot Camp
 - **Maximum 3 members per team to join the Boot Camp.**

How to apply for CUPP?

- CUPP is a programme on **nomination-based**.
- Interested applicants should **contact CUPP 2026 Co-organising universities** for nomination details.
- Nominated teams should provide their academic performance, award received, entrepreneurial experience and **proposed project to your respective universities** for consideration.
- Written test and interview will be arranged after the nomination deadline.
- **Written test and video upload (via Typeform to be sent to individual team upon confirmation of nomination)** will be reviewed by the **overseas hosting university, LSE**. **Link** for written application key information to facilitate preparation.
- Nominated teams shall pitch their business idea (max 4-minute in English) to **Cyberport Vetting Team (Industry Professionals)** during the interview.
- Selected teams will be **notified** by email from Cyberport **by end April**.

Pitch :	A maximum of 6-minute pitch (plus 4-minute QA if there are questions from judges)

Stage 1 - Written Test with Video (10%) + Interview (90%)

A. **Written test with video (10%)** : the written test will **assess conceptual and strategic clarity**, while the **video** will offer insight into the applicant team's confidence, fluency, ability, and chemistry with teammates to articulate their vision without external assistance (such as Chat GPT). Each application will be reviewed independently by the LSE Generate team using a standardised scoring framework to evaluate against the following **five core criteria** :

Five Core Criteria	Key Attributes
Problem and solution fit	clarity in articulating the problem being solved and the novelty or effectiveness of the proposed solution
Market understanding and validation	evidence of market research, customer discovery, and early traction through pilots, user testing, or initial sales
Business model and scalability	soundness of the business model, financial feasibility, and scalability potential within Hong Kong and wider markets
Team and execution capacity	diversity of skills within the founding team, clarity of roles, team member compatibility and demonstrated ability to deliver on strategic objectives
Impact, relevance and alignment	With AI, Blockchain, Cybersecurity, and/or Data Science fields

* *Assessment Rating Scale : Each criterion will be scored on a 1-5 scale, for each criterion, rate from 1 (Very Weak) to 5 (Excellent)*

B. **Interview (90%)**: nominated teams shall come to Cyberport to pitch their business idea **in person**. **Maximum 4-minute pitch in English plus 4-minute QA** if there are questions from the Vetting Team, during the interview. The interview assessment criteria as follow:

Interview (90%)	Attitude - 20% Communications - 20% Entrepreneurial Aspiration - 20% Knowledge of AI, Blockchain, Cybersecurity and Data Science Technologies - 20% Project Idea - 10%

CUPP Demo Day Judging Criteria

Project Management Team (30%)

The capability of the project management team is evaluated according to track record, execution ability, probability of launch, individual qualifications and roles within the team.

Business Model and Time to Market (30%)

The business model is evaluated by the short and long term objectives, apparent market need, target market and marketing strategy, and realistic assessment of the project viability. Projects that launch within three months of grant disbursement are preferred.

Creativity and Innovation of the Proposed Project, Product and Service (30%)

Innovative technology, creative solutions, disruptive ideas, emerging technology and higher score will be given to solutions with breakthrough problem-solving attribute.

Social Responsibility (10%)

Preference will be given to projects with socially responsible dimensions, such as open source software, creative commons IP, ethical decision making, or which contribute to solving social problems.

CUPPers Admission Fee and Deposit

(paid upon successful admission)



Admission Fee

All CUPP participants are required to pay a **non-refundable HK\$3,000 Admission Fee**, no matter join Boot Camp or not

Deposit

A refundable deposit will be collected from all CUPP Participants

HK\$6,000 deposit for individuals joining the Entrepreneurship Boot Camp; or

HK\$3,000 deposit for individuals NOT joining the Entrepreneurship Boot Camp

This deposit will be refunded upon full attendance of the CUPP Programme and satisfactory performance as assessed by Cyberport.

Notes

1. The above payment shall be settled at admission in Apr-May 2026.
2. The admission fee covers part of CUPP administrative costs, and all the fee collected would be used for Cyberport public mission start-up training programmes.
3. CUPPers successfully admitted into CUPP will join CUPP 2026 funded by Cyberport for pre-camp nurturing sessions in Hong Kong and Entrepreneurship Boot Camp at the hosting university, including training fee, insurance, accommodation and air ticket (Note: round-trip economy group air tickets will be provided, but CUPPers are allowed to purchase round-trip economy class air tickets and reimburse the air ticket fee up to an approved amount from Cyberport. The reimbursement is only allowed if they could provide valid reasons and supporting documents for travelling from cities outside of Hong Kong or having a longer stay in the destination. After the CUPPers are admitted to CUPP 2026, they need to confirm whether they would like to travel with the group air tickets provided or purchase their own air tickets when they submit the CUPP terms and conditions confirmation reply slip. 4. CUPP teams are required to join all activities throughout the programme. Cyberport reserved the right to request applicants and/or CUPP teams, who do not participate in CUPP 2026 Demo Day, to pay back the expenses incurred for their attendance in the CUPP 2026.
