Shipping Research Ranking (updated)

Researchers at PolyU have made outstanding contributions to shipping research. According to Thomson Reuters' *ISI Web of Science*, PolyU tops the list among the world's leading shipping schools in shipping research, in terms of published papers in SSCI journals over the past three years.

The report shows that a total of 561 shipping articles were published in the Transportation category during 2017-2019, among which 56 papers were produced by PolyU's colleagues. PolyU came first in the world ranking.

Maritime Economists

The 28th Annual Conference of the International Association of Maritime Economists (IAME) was held via Zoom on 10 -13 June 2020. The director of Shipping Research Centre, Professor Mike Lai, chaired the conference and the deputy director, Dr Yang Dong, was the co-chair for academic programme.

The IAME 2020 online conference carries the theme of "Sustainable Development of Shipping and Trade", covering environmental and social issues in shipping and trade beyond the economic focus to recognise the increasing importance of sustainability in balancing and improving the triple bottom line for industry development. IAME 2020 provides a forum to address both the theoretical and practical issues associated with sustainable shipping management to facilitate and support international trade in today's dynamic, complex, and uncertain business world. IAME 2020 serves as a platform to facilitate international research and industrial collaboration to examine the multifaceted issues related to sustainability in shipping and trade.

A total of 229 presentations of 73 extended abstracts and 156 full papers from 38 countries are accepted. 10 special sessions, 40 academic sessions and 1 industry session were scheduled in our IAME 2020 online conference programme.

Major contributors come from China, followed by South Korea and Greece.

Among all the Tracks, "Port Economics, Policy and Management" is the most popular one. Followed by Logistics and Supply Chain.


