### > CILT Council Member

Dr Venus Lun, Director of Shipping Research Centre, was elected to the Council of The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong (CILTHK) at the CILTHK Annual General Meeting 2012. She will serve on the CILTHK Council for two years from 2012 to 2014. CILTHK is the professional body for those engaged in various sectors of transport and logistics, including air, sea, and land transportation.



The Chartered Institute of Transport was formed in the United Kingdom in 1919 as the Institute of Transport and became a Chartered Institute in 1926. The Institute first set up the Hong Kong Branch in 1968 and it was upgraded to the Hong Kong Section in 1972. On 1 October 1991, the Hong Kong Section was upgraded to National Council status and renamed as the Chartered Institute of Transport in Hong Kong. The Institute was renamed as the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong (CILTHK) in July 2001.

# > Delivery of a Talk at NKMU

#### > Meet the Editors


