

LTLGB 2012

The 2012 International Conference on Low-carbon Transportation and Logistics, and Green Buildings (LTLGB) was held at Beijing Jiaotong University on 12-13 October 2012. The conference was hosted by Beijing Jiaotong University in cooperation with the University of Liverpool, and sponsored by the National Natural Science Foundation of China and the K. C. Wong Education Foundation. The conference was also supported by the Shipping Research Centre of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, the Centre for Housing Innovations of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Academy of Mathematics and Systems Science of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, and the School of Economics and Management of Beijing University of Chemical Technology.





Prof. Edwin Cheng was one of the Honorary Chairmen of the LTLGB 2012. The conference was an international forum for both researchers and industry practitioners with three simultaneous tracks, covering "Low-carbon Transportation", "Low-carbon Logistics", and "Green Buildings". LTLGB 2012 received 252 submissions from 11 countries. 134 papers were accepted for presentation at the conference after rigorous peer reviews.

> SCS for the Logistics Industry

The Specifications of Competency Standards (SCS) for three branches of the logistics industry, namely "Land Transport & Distribution", "Terminal, Warehouse & Logistics Centre", and "Supporting & Ancillary Services", are undergoing industry consultation. The consultation will last for six months from August 2012 to February 2013.
