Most Prolific and Most-cited Researcher

According to the Times Higher Education (THE), Dr Mike Lai Kee Hung (Deputy Director, Shipping Research Centre) had the highest average citation count around the world in Business, Management and Accounting in the period between 2011 and 2015.

During the period, Dr Lai had 50 publications in the research area of Logistics and Shipping under the subject area of Business, Management and Accounting with Citations per publication at 25.1.

The THE table lists the most-cited researcher in each of 10 different subject areas. It only employed data on researchers with many publications to their name in the period. Those who garnered lots of citations with just a handful of papers were filtered out.

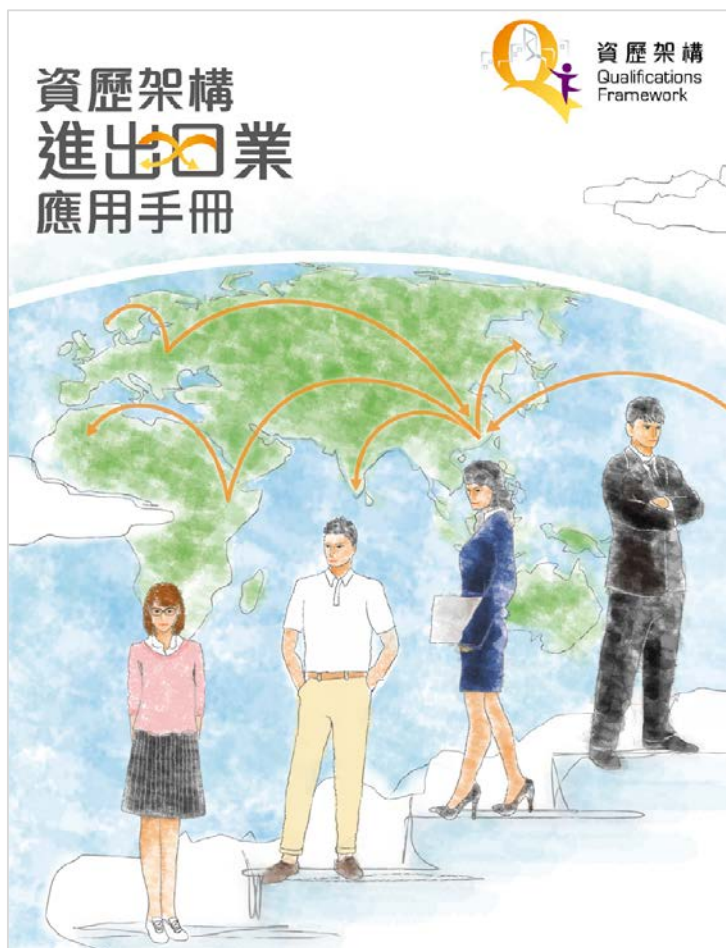

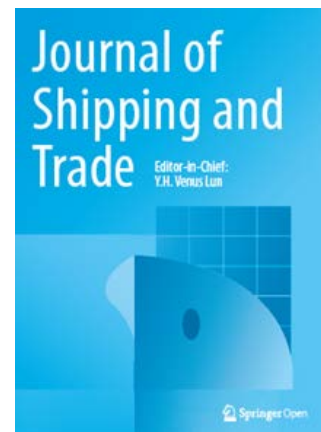
Call for Papers: *JST*
