1972

- The Hong Kong Polytechnic was formally established on 1 August 1972, taking over the campus and staff of Hong Kong Technical College.
- Some students were required to attend classes in temporary classrooms in Tsim Sha Tsui East (currently Hotel Icon), while new buildings were being constructed.
- Most courses at technician and craft levels were gradually transferred to



Morrison Hill Technical Institute. Mr KC Ho left for Morrison Hill Technical Institute in 1975.

1973


- The Department was renamed The Department of Mechanical and Marine Engineering in 1973, with production programmes transferred to the newly formed Department of Production and Industrial Engineering.
- I-year full-time Associateship in Mechanical Engineering preparing students for the C.E.I Part II examination commenced.

1975

2-year full-time Diploma in Mechanical Engineering commenced.

1978/79


- 4-year Sandwich Higher Diploma in Marine Engineering replaced the Ordinary Diploma in Marine Engineering.
- 2-year Diploma in Aircraft Engineering commenced and was phased out in 1988; with 228 graduates in total.
- Mrs Lui Ng Ying-bik who joined our Department in 1978 was probably the first female teaching staff while Dr LH Yam was the second to join our Department in 1989. Both of them have retired.

1979/80

- Higher Certificate in Mechanical Engineering was recognized by the Institution of Technician Engineers in Mechanical Engineering (ITEME).
- In 1979, our Department had 1,452 students (409 in Higher Diploma in Mechanical Engineering or Marine Engineering, 103 in Diploma in Mechanical Engineering.

1980/81

- The Pao Siu-loong Marine Engineering Training Laboratory, funded by World-Wide Shipping Group, and Seawise Laboratories, funded by the late Mr CY Tung, were officially opened by Governor, Sir Murray MacLehose, in 1981 and 1982, respectively.
- Planning started for the BEng programme in 1981, which was validated by the CNAA in 1982.
- A Symposium on Automatic Control Engineering Techniques, jointly organised by our Department and South China

Institute of Technology, was held in Guangzhou on December

1983/84

- In October 1983, the Polytechnic began to operate its first degree programmes. Our Department accordingly started the BEng(Hons)
 Degree in Mechanical Engineering a four-year programme with compulsory sandwich training in the third year.
- The Higher Diploma in Marine Engineering was accredited by the Institute of Marine Engineers.

1984/85

Irene, Liu Oi-yee (admitted in 1984 and graduated in 1988) was the first female BEng student in our Department.





1987

- Joint Higher Diploma in Aeronautical, Marine, and Mechanical Engineering programme commenced in 1987 and was phased out in 1990.
- The Higher Diploma in Aeronautical Engineering (2-year full-time study) followed by 2-year part-time day-release study) commenced in 1987. In 1990/91, Mr Simon Cheung, a year-four student of the course, became the first Polytechnic student to be selected by Cathy Pacific Airways as a cadet

- 2-year Post-graduate Diploma in Precision Engineering commenced.
- With a generous donation from Elec and Eltek Co. Ltd., our Department established the Precision Engineering Centre.

1992

The Higher Diploma in Marine Engineering was phased out.



- Part-time MSc in Precision Engineering commenced and was phased out in 1997.
- Part-time MSc in Mechanical Engineering commenced.
- In 1989, our Department offered a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering, 5 Higher Diploma programmes in Mechanical Engineering, Marine Engineering, and Aeronautical Engineering; other courses including Higher Certificate in Mechanical Engineering, Endorsement to Higher Certificate in Mechanical Engineering, and Postgraduate Diploma in Precision Engineering.
- The BEng(Hons) in Mechanical Engineering programme was accredited by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (UK) and the CNAA.

1991


So Chi Kin was the first MPhil student who graduated in 1991, supervised by Dr PC Tse and Dr TC Lai.
