	After the initial research plan, students monitor their own progress throughout the preparation of the proposal. They are encouraged to seek advice from Chief Supervisors whenever necessary. Progress Continuous monitoring is made on students' performance such as: discussion of assigned readings; quality of submitted written assignments such as literature review; annotated bibliographies; comprehension of the task in hand; planning, initiative, and thoroughness of investigation.
