Navigating a Meaningful Career as a Management Professor

Abstract

Being a management professor is a wonderful job. In this workshop we will discuss how to have a meaningful and successful career in this profession.

David M. Mayer is an Associate Professor in the Management and Organizations Area at the University of Michigan's Ross School of Business. He received his PhD from the University of Maryland. He conducts research in two primary areas: (1) behavioral ethics in organizations, and (2) organizational/social justice. The majority of his research addresses the following question: When and why do individuals in organizations engage in unethical and prosocial behavior? He generally explores the influence of the social context in organizations, such as the ethical environment (e.g., leadership, culture, peers) and the fair treatment of employees, on employees' unethical and prosocial conduct. He has published over 50 articles/chapters including over 25 articles in the following top management journals: *Academy of Management Journal*, *Journal of Applied Psychology*, *Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes*, and *Personnel Psychology*. He is currently an associate editor at the *Academy of Management Journal*.
