Science of Stroke Recovery

This course is designed to delineate the stroke recovery process and its underlying scientific rationale. Following the clinical case from Human Anatomy for Stroke, the course walks participants through the recovery journey, or stroke care pathway, involving multiple healthcare professionals. It goes on to explore intervention approaches practised in key healthcare disciplines, before assessing participants' knowledge using an experiential, case-based approach.

This certificate program covers a wide spectrum of stroke management from clinical to community perspectives. We advocate for partnership of patients and healthcare professionals. The programme can broaden the horizon of various personnel in stroke rehabilitation management.

It concludes with six healthcare discipline-specific role play videos and lectures given by a team of visiting professors from each field.

It has also been shown, however, that badly-done Service-Learning is counterproductive and can reinforce and entrench stereotypes. It is also known that the learning experience is by far and away the most impactful pedagogical factor in ensuring positive learning outcomes in Service-Learning, hence we developed this course, to help and support our teachers.
