## 1 Managing Human Resources in the Hospitality and Tourism Industry\*

This course analyses contemporary issues in the management of human capital in the hospitality and tourism industry, within both macro- and micro-perspectives. Participants will learn how organisational culture impacts human capital and how different cultures approach human resource management. The course also cultivates leadership skills, enabling participants to staff their teams effectively and manage employee motivation.

## 2 Managing Marketing in the Hospitality and Tourism Industry

Learn the latest principles and theories in marketing and how to apply them to the hospitality and tourism industry.

This course explores the unique challenges presented by marketing within the hospitality and tourism industry, in which the focus is on selling services and memories rather than goods. Participants will learn best practices for building customer loyalty and creating a strong brand and learn how to efficiently communicate with stakeholders through integrated marketing communications.

## 3 Hospitality and Tourism Technology and Innovation

Gain an in-depth understanding of the strategic applications of information and communication technologies innovations in the hospitality and tourism industry.

This course looks in depth at the strategic applications of information and communication technologies (ICT) innovations in the hospitality and tourism industry. Participants will learn about the role of ICT infrastructures and tools in shaping business environments, business models, marketing practices, revenue strategies and customer service. The course also explores how big data analytics can support decision-making.

## 4 Luxury Management

Understand the power of a luxury brand and gain the business skills needed to provide premium goods and services within the hospitality and tourism industry.

This course equips participants with the strategies and skills for managing luxury brands within the hospitality and tourism industry. Participants will analyse the essence of a luxury brand and learn marketing techniques and trends to better position their services. They also can learn how luxury brands are created and how to effectively communicate the value of their brand.

Learn the construction and style adaptations of skirts from a design and creation perspective, completing the course with your own designed and made-to-measure finished skirt sample.

This course covers how to design and create unique skirts of any length or width, with different waistbands, pockets, openings, pleats, gathers and godets. Participants develop the skills to adapt basic blocks and patterns to individual designs by use of fullness and manipulation techniques, and create specification sheets for commercial patterns and manufacturing.

## 2 Designing and Creating Trousers

Learn the construction and style adaptations of trousers for men and women, from a design and creation perspective, completing the course with your own designed and made-to-measure finished trouser sample.

This course covers how to design and create jeans and casual trousers like cargo pants, dance pants and jogging bottoms using different patch pockets, seaming details and fly front constructions. Participants learn how to sew lining into trousers and construct jet and welt tailored pockets. The designs provided should inspire them to create their own unique style, using their own choice of fabrics, for a specific body shape and size.

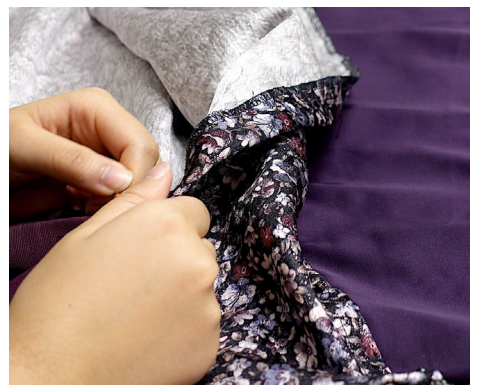

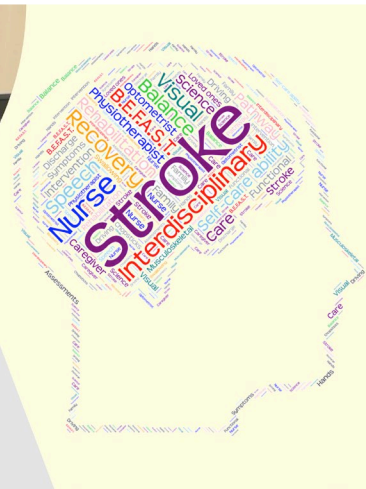

## Science of Stroke Recovery

This certificate program covers a wide spectrum of stroke management from clinical to community perspectives. We advocate for partnership of patients and healthcare professionals. The programme can broaden the horizon of various personnel in stroke rehabilitation management.

Learn about human anatomy from multiple healthcare professional perspectives through a case-based study of stroke.

In this course, participants gain an understanding of the basic concepts of anatomy and learn to 'dissect' the human body with a logical approach through exploring a typical clinical case of stroke. The course then moves on to present a series of video lectures on human anatomy, related to the case. It concludes with six healthcare discipline-specific role play videos and lectures given by a team of visiting professors from each field.

Learn the rationale behind the stroke care pathway for supporting treatments and rehabilitation.

This course is designed to delineate the stroke recovery process and its underlying scientific rationale. Following the clinical case from [Human Anatomy for Stroke](#), the course walks participants through the recovery journey, or stroke care pathway, involving multiple healthcare professionals. It goes on to explore intervention approaches practised in key healthcare disciplines, before assessing participants' knowledge using an experiential, case-based approach.

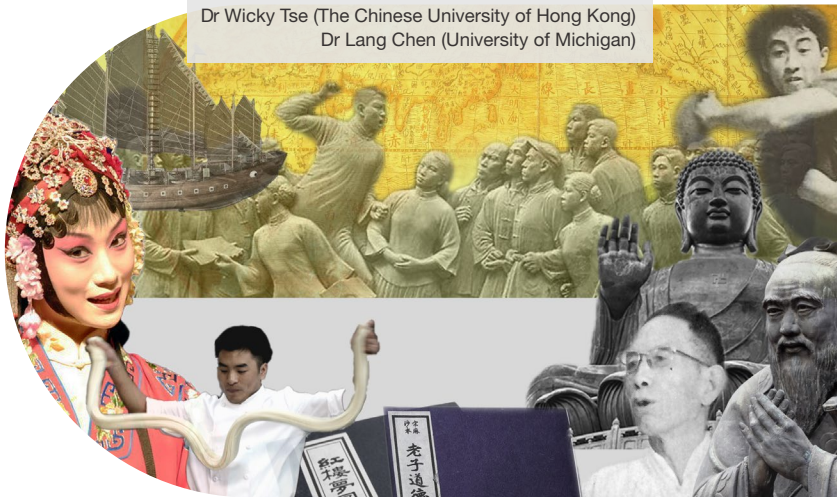
# XSeries Programme in Chinese Culture: Tradition, Transformation and Interaction
