3. Project Implementation

(a) Project objectives

Development of an exemplar subject:

- (i) Revise the programme documents to shift the emphasis on subject contents and teaching methodologies to the learning outcomes, the learning approaches to achieve the learning outcomes and assessment of the students' achievement of the learning outcomes.
- (ii) Prepare students for effective participation in outcome-based learning.
- (iii) Develop/enhance methods of assessing students' learning outcomes.
- (b) Overview of specific work undertaken for achieving the project objectives (including any changes to original proposal)

A summary of the project tasks undertaken is given below.

Overall, the project has been effectively executed with all initiatives set in the Project Proposal completed. Furthermore, some extension of work has been undertaken such as experiences dissemination and graduate feedback collection. The completed tasks fall into the following 5 categories:-

- (1) Preparation for students' effective participation under the OBE
 - (i) Student learning experiences interviews a 24-page "Student Interviews Analyses and Report" has been prepared.
 - (ii) Provision of learning guidance to students A "Study Guide for the BSE Undergraduate Students" has been prepared and uploaded on the BSE student intranet for students to use.
- (2) Collection of staff feedbacks about the OBE implementation
 - BSE academic staff interviews (voluntary participation) 13 staff interviews completed with each lasted for around 1 hour.
 - (ii) A 44 page "Academic Staff Interviews Analysis and Report" was prepared.
- (3) Development of an OBE Exemplar Subject
 - (i) The revision of the subject documentation, the delivery of the subject and the assessment methods.
 - (ii) Student feedback collection students were interviewed at beginning and end of the subject teaching.
 - (iii) Questionnaire-based survey of students at subject completion and associated statistical analysis
 - (iv) A "Report on the Development of an OBE Exemplar Subject Lighting Systems and Applications" was prepared.
- (4) Industry practitioners' inputs to teaching and learning
 - (i) Questionnaires were prepared and 16 industry practitioners were selected.
 - (ii) Return rate was satisfactory and the data is being analysed.
- (5) Dissemination of empirical findings Two articles were written and submitted to The International Journal of Engineering Education. These are currently under review:
 - "Outcome-based Education at the Subject Level: A Case Study of Engineering Discipline in Hong Kong"
 - (ii) "Effective Implementation of Outcome-Based Education: A Case Study of Engineering Discipline in Hong Kong"
- (c) Difficulties encountered, if any, which have affected progress, and remedial actions taken
 - Difficulties were encountered on the recruitment of Project Fellow and Project Associates/Assistants. The Project Fellow could only be recruited in January 2009.
- (d) Deliverables/useful findings/good practices emerged
 - 1. A 24-page "Student Interviews Analyses and Report" has been prepared.
 - A "Study Guide for the BSE Undergraduate Students" has been prepared and uploaded on the BSE student intranet for students to use.

- 3. A 44 page "Academic Staff Interviews Analysis and Report" was prepared.
- 4. A "Report on the Development of an OBE Exemplar Subject Lighting Systems and Applications" was prepared.
- 5. The work and results of this project was presented in the departmental L&T forum on 11 June 2010.

Two journal papers were submitted to The International Journal of Engineering Education. The papers are still under review.
