What will students do to serve?	<p>Students will interact with the ethnic minorities (such as South Asian children) to understand the difficulties faced by the ethnic minorities in integrating into society. Students will assist the service recipients to create maps of particular themes (such as shopping preferences, reaching out to community facilities) that they are interested in. Students will teach the ethnic minorities to use these newly-created maps during map reading workshops. The goal is to empower the ethnic minorities through minimizing the information divide with respect to geographical information – in other words, to help extend their integration and understanding beyond their own ethnic community and geographical area.</p>
