Students are required to work in groups (10~15+ per group) to develop a vision screening project to serve underprivileged communities in Hong Kong, mainland China or overseas*.# throughout this two-semester subject. Site visit(s) will be arranged prior to the vision screening. Students will be delegated with different tasks to render and serve before, during and after the screening activities throughout a two-semester duration.
