<b>What will students do to serve?</b>	<p>Service learning will be based on group projects. Each group will work with an environmental NGO, working on specific environmental issues faced by affected communities in either Hong Kong or mainland China.</p> <p>Based on field study of specific communities, each group will propose and deliver a project with the objectives of community service and service learning. The project must have a clearly defined community, and students can choose from a wide array of community services, including conducting voluntary environmental education in a community, providing solutions to an environmental issue faced by the community concerned, working with NGOs to advocate policy changes to address specific environmental challenges faced by the community concerned, or partnering with both NGOs and business firms to design corporate environmental initiatives to serve specific communities, etc.</p>
