PolyU students will be involved in the learning, teaching and designing of simple mechatronic devices to illustrate key STEM concepts to secondary students; guide and facilitate secondary students to build an assistive device to promote healthy lifestyle. The exact nature of the project may vary depending on the needs of the collaborating schools and students.</p> <p>There is a one-day STEM competition on 13th July for secondary students to showcase their creativity.
