What will students do to serve?	Taiwan is multicultural. Recent years, a growing number of new immigrants from South Eastern countries have had rooted in Taiwan and it raises the importance of issues on the harmony of multi-ethnic groups, the identity of “new Taiwanese”, and social equity. A ‘New Taiwanese’ is a child of a bi-cultural family (Taiwanese father, South-Eastern Asian mother) who typically lives in a poorer fishing or farmer village. There are multiple challenges for such families and especially for the mother and child. Students taking the subject will travel to Taiwan and they will be involved in interviewing the new immigrants and their children who received education and work in Taiwan, focusing on the cultural and social identity, the social and cultural adaptation, and the social network in Taiwan. Students will also observe and study the emergence of cultural industry of new immigrants’ mother-countries, and their cultures’ transformation and the influence on Taiwan local.
