



A new paradigm of internationalisation of the curriculum


- 1. Outcomes rather than inputs focused
- 2. For all students rather than a minority
- 3. Planned and intentional rather than haphazard
- 4. Integrated rather than peripheral





We need to create a learning environment where every student can say, this is my place (p52) 'creating an internationalised campus environment through the provision of a curriculum and services that support student engagement with diversity, including the cultural and linguistic diversity that surrounds them in the world, in class and on campus (Leask 2009, p. 206).






A conceptual framework of internationalisation of the curriculum
