

To assist students in fulfilling the WIE requirement, the Careers and Placement Section (CPS) of the Student Affairs Office supports academic departments in coordinating WIE programmes that offer internship opportunities in Hong Kong, Mainland China, and overseas. To encourage students to take on a meaningful placement outside Hong Kong for developing a global outlook while acquiring work competencies, student participants may apply for the Offshore WIE Sponsorship to cover part of the costs incurred during their WIE trip.




WIE 2021 internships outside Hong Kong by Faculty/School



HU Yutong


BBA (Hons) in Financial Services

BBA (Hons) in International Shipping and Transport Logistics


Ethical Trade Alliance | Melbourne, Australia

I believed I could leverage this precious experience to better prepare myself to be a professional AO in the future.




HO Hiu Man

Our Mainland WIE programmes have been endeavouring to facilitate PolyU students' undertaking to work as interns in the Greater Bay Area, particularly Shenzhen, where various technology enterprises, CPA firms, and start-ups are headquartered. The Greater Bay Area Internship Programme, in particular, has assisted PolyU students in expanding career network and explore career opportunities in the Area, thanks to the support from the Home Affairs Bureau, the Hong Kong government.
